NEWS ABOUT CARLEY WARRINGTON



Regular readers will remember in the February 2009 edition we printed a "Thank You" to Zoe Pass-Wragg and Paul Wragg for sponsoring Carley Warrington's sports management degree in the USA. Well, Carley is doing exceedingly well and we have just received this news from Belmont Abbey College!

"The eighth-ranked Belmont Abbey women's golf team finished third and junior Carley Warrington won the individual title by six shots at the Larry Nelson Invitational, hosted by Kennesaw State University at the par 72 Chateau Course in Braselton, Georgia. Belmont Abbey, the only Division II team in a field of nine teams, finished with a three-round team score of 951, 12 shots back of Gardner-Webb and ten shots behind Samford. The Abbey posted a final round score of 318 after opening with rounds of 323 and 310. Warrington earned medalist honours for the first time this season after carding rounds of 75-71-74=220 (+4). In three rounds she posted 12 birdies, including five in today's final round."

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Newburgh Development

Peak Park planners say they are still in discussions with Newburgh Engineering and that it may be June before the application goes to their planning committee for a decision. John Keeley, chief planning officer for the northern region, has agreed to meet the PC in early May to discuss PDNPA's latest views on the proposed development.

Councillor vacancy

Councillor Jackie Byrne has decided to give up her seat on the PC to concentrate on her other interests. We thank her for her work for the village and her regular attendances at committees.

Grants to village organisations

At our meeting on April 7th, we provisionally agreed to the following requests for financial assistance.

- 1 £1000 to Bradwell Memorial Hall Committee as partial match-funding towards the repair or replacement of the central heating system.
- 2 Up to £500 to Bradwell Teddy Bear Club as match funding towards the cost of an outdoor play area, chairs and a storage shed (subject to planning approval).

Also at our meeting on April 7th it was decided not to continue with 'adverse possession' of this plot.

We had recently been approached by a resident who claimed ownership of the land - offering to donate it to the Parish Council if we would arrange the transfer. The documents we were shown certainly supported the resident's ownership of the plot but our solicitor advised us that they were insufficient to enable a transfer. Consequently, since the 'adverse possession' process appears inappropriate, now that we believe we know the owner, we decided to take no further steps towards acquiring this land. Chris Furness

WALKING YOUR DOG

Peak District dog-walkers are asked to keep their pets on short leads to protect wildlife, lambs and calves while out in the countryside during the breeding season. Peak District National Park rangers, the Kennel Club and rural police all remind petowners that, by law they must keep their dogs under control so that they do not scare farm animals and wildlife. Sheep and lambs can be badly injured by uncontrolled dogs during the lambing season. Ground-nesting birds like curlew and lapwing, and wild creatures such as hares, are also easily disturbed. Legally, you do not have to use a lead on public paths as long as the dog is under close control, but National Park management are asking dog-owners to be extra-vigilant in the breeding season, and always clip on the lead if you cannot rely on your dog's obedience. For its own safety, you should never let your dog approach or chase wildlife and farm animals. It can get kicked, trampled or lost, and it could be shot for chasing livestock. Kennel Club communications director Caroline Kisko said: "Dog owners have a responsibility under the Countryside and Rights of Way (CROW) Act to keep their dogs on a lead around wildlife between March 1 and July 31 and at any time in the vicinity of livestock. The countryside is for all to enjoy but dog owners must be respectful of this issue when walking their dog."

REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

April's meeting was a talk on Quilting by Joyce Gould who gave an entertaining talk surrounded by many of her superb creations. Joyce started by giving us a brief history of quilting. The earliest known guilt was found in Cairo, circa 980 BC and made from goats leather. A Roman mattress dating from 100 AD showed that some Romans enjoyed a high level of luxury whilst by the 15th century guilts were fairly common. The advent of the sewing machine speeded up the process quite considerably but by 1945 quilting had virtually died out in England due to the introduction of man made fibres. 30 years later it was reintroduced into Britain from the USA and in 2000 Joyce's daughter persuaded her to start quilting! Joyce is now an expert, with a number of her creations shown at exhibitions. She then showed us the basics using templates, wadding, cotton fabric and a ferocious looking roller cutter (looking suspiciously like a pizza cutter!). This was accompanied by a stern warning - "Use a cutting board" - it saves your dining room table from ruin! The evening ended with a display of just some of her creations. Amazing quilts, wall hangings and cushion covers nearly all, astonishingly, done painstakingly by hand.


