

KILBARCHAN WEST PARISH CHURCH

Newsletter Autumn 2014

Dear Friends,

I am sure that the two questions which will be uppermost in the minds of many church members in Kilbarchan are these: when will the union take place? and which church building will be the place of worship for the united congregation? I am still not in a position to answer either of these questions, although I can explain what is holding things up.

The Basis of Union stipulated that an architect should be appointed to examine both buildings and come forward with a recommendation. The architect's report became available in late May. It recommended the West building. However, there does not appear to have been a great deal between the two and the East trustees are challenging it. Five office-bearers from each congregation have been appointed to meet together and try to resolve the difficulty. They have been meeting over the summer, but to date little progress has been made. I think we still need more time to for both sides to listen to each other and perhaps gather more information.

The matter will not be allowed to drift on indefinitely. The office-bearers who are currently engaged in discussions have been given a deadline of mid-October, although they could conclude earlier if they wish. Thereafter their recommendation will need to be discussed and voted upon by the West Kirk Session and the East Session and Congregational Board. Subsequently, there will need to be congregational meetings in each church to consider their recommendation. At this stage you will have a say in the matter. If both congregations vote the same way, that is the situation resolved. Otherwise, it will need to go to arbitration which could take a while.

What arbitration involves is a panel of five people appointed from the Central Properties Department of the Church of Scotland. Their decision would be final and binding on both sides. I remain hopeful that this can be avoided. I consider it best if a decision can be made locally and both sides take ownership of that decision. For that reason I believe it is worth spending time in the present in the hope of getting it right.

However, even if we have to end up going to arbitration, the Presbytery will be able to set a date for the service of union as soon as the congregational meetings have taken place. We do not need to wait until we know the arbiters' decision.

I appeal for your patience as we continue with this process. I also ask for your prayers for those currently involved in negotiations. Both congregations cherish their current building. What we need is a vision for the church which will best serve the needs of the new Kilbarchan Parish Church in the future.

Church of Scotland Safeguarding Service

Processing of application forms for The Protection of Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme is almost complete in Kilbarchan West, with the last remaining few being issued this month. Please pass this on to me if you haven't already.

Safe Recruitment

Any organisation considering recruiting new volunteers (or paid staff) must contact me before doing so as The Church of Scotland Safeguarding Service has set procedures that must be complied with. This also applies to anyone already having a PVG certificate.

Do not appoint anyone until the recruitment process has been completed.

Recognising and Reporting Abuse

Harm or abuse of children or vulnerable adults can happen anywhere – even in our Church communities. We all have a responsibility to ensure the Church is safe for everyone.

If you *suspect* harm, witness harm, or it is reported to you, you must immediately report it to your Safeguarding Coordinator or line manager.

As always do not hesitate to ask me or your group leader about any aspect of Safeguarding no matter how trivial it may seem. It's better to be safe than sorry.
