## Chairman's Blog – October 2013

Well, I am just back from a few days in Oxfordshire. Whilst there, we visited the Botanical Gardens, which was very worthwhile. The honeybees were feasting on the autumn flowering plants, the names of which I will never remember. Whoever they belonged to is a fortunate beekeeper, having such a variety of forage throughout the year. The previous Saturday was the DBKA EC meeting, which went quite well. I raised the issue of the VAT proposal and this will be chased up. I hope that my comment about it being exceptionally rude of the BBKA not to have responded by now will be minuted. Terry put a lot of work into a paper that everyone I know thinks is a very good idea and a response is the least that we should expect. By the way, they are looking for a new treasurer to take over from Richard Howes next March. If any of you would like to know more about the role, have a chat with me as I did it for ten years before Richard took over. We had a presentation at the meeting from a Torbay member about the “Cornish Black Bee” at Paignton Zoo. As you may have read, some Cornish beekeepers think they have discovered their native bee. I was very sceptical about this, but as Ken Basterfield NDB is far more knowledgeable about bees and their pedigree than me, I left it to him to take the poor chap to task! In a couple of minutes, Ken clarified that it was highly unlikely that this is a pure bred bee and is far more likely to be a mongrel, like all of the bees in this part of the world, even if it is a very good bee. Indeed, mating was discussed and unless artificial insemination is used, the chances of virgin queens mating with “pure bred” drones is nigh on impossible.

Anyway, enough of my ramblings. I hope that you have all finished feeding your colonies, but it is not too late if you have light hives that require more food. The ivy has not started here on the edge of Dartmoor, but I have no doubt that it has in the tropical areas like Newton Ferrers and Wembury! The pollen is very good, but the nectar does go rock hard and the bees have difficulty eating it in the early spring. The less of the latter in the hive, the better!

The next meeting is on 10th October and I would urge as many of you as possible to come along and hear what the BeeVet has to say, especially about the control of varroa. New members are particularly welcome. Also, don't forget to let Jean know if you want to visit Portreath Bee Centre on November 3rd. That will be a good day out.
