Review of the 2010 season by Ralph Pruden 1st XI Captain

As years go 2010 was a pretty special one. A 20/20 World cup secured, retaining the Ashes with a dominant swagger down under for the first time in my memory and of course, sandwiched in the middle, the first ever league title for Rougham!

Our season rather spluttered into action, a bleary eyed captain substituting behind the stumps and failing to do anything other than gently guide the team to comfortable defeat on a flat track. The only highlights being runs for Jay and a stylish not out for Nick Drewry, things we would see many times more. Two outstanding away wins followed at Cornard and Melford with Alex contributing 133 runs in total. We were soon brought crashing back down to earth however as we succumbed to a horrible home defeat to Elveden, totally imploding from a winning position to give the visitors their only win of the season.

These two early defeats left promotion looking decidedly

unlikely. The outlook changed dramatically though as we went on a run of eight victories in a row including total demolition of Cornard (190 runs), Woolpit (8 wickets), Risby (8 wickets), Sudbury (107 runs), Elmswell (8 wickets), Haverhill (6 wickets). Undoubtedly the best game came at top of the table Horringer, set 201 on a sticky wicket we chased it with 2 balls and 3 wickets to spare, a stodgy 87 from Rob Dovaston and the nerve and running of the long legged Firths seeing us home.

A home drubbing by Melford made us sweat but comfortable wins by 10 wickets, 99 runs and 7 wickets left us knowing that 9 points from our final two matches would see us guaranteed to finish top. Sudbury sent a strong team to Rougham but we continued our form, bowling them out for under 200. Following yet another great partnership from the run machine Jay and Rob at the top of the order we gradually fell away, as the 8th wicket fell we were still 43 runs from the

championship and almost 60 away from outright victory. I can say without a doubt that it was my proudest sporting moment to hit the runs that took us past the 9 point barrier and subsequently those that secured the win, again with 1 wicket and 2 balls remaining. By the time we finished our season the following week our minds were elsewhere and as is traditional we lost away to Risby!

Our success stemmed from many outstanding individual performances, enormous strength in depth and a group of players who love their cricket and of course the opportunity for the odd cheeky (be it net or pint)!

The coming season is fast approaching and I cannot wait! Division 3 holds no fear for us and although I want to stop short of making brash predictions about consecutive league titles, I do feel that we will be very competitive.

Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to report that even though the Club made a deficit, this was still an improvement from the previous year. This was mainly due to an improvement in the method for collecting our match fees and a surplus from our 2009 Awards Night

It was decided at the AGM that our match fees and standing orders will remain at the same level as of previous years as it was felt that through this economic downturn it wasn't right for us to increase our fees. However, as a Club we need to increase our income to support the ambitions and vision to expand and develop the Club.

Following the AGM it was decided to set up a sub-committee to look into fundraising and other methods of income generation for the Club. We are looking to find a main Club sponsor who would appear on our shirts and would feature on any advertising promotional events. Ideally this would run over a 3-year deal generating some regular income for the Club. There are a number of other areas we are looking to get sponsored, i.e. scoreboard, ground, match ball, etc. If you are aware of any-

body who may be interested in supporting the club in this way, please do not hesitate to contact me.

As mentioned above we are looking at running fundraising events during the year, more details on this will appear as plans are confirmed, so please watch this space. If you have any ideas about how to raise money for the club please speak to me, Alex or Sam.


