Cheap Computers for Older People

At long last the Council has set up a scheme to provide cheap computers for people over 65 - something the Forum has been urging for more than three years.

The project is in partnership with a company called Byteback (based in Hartcliffe), and will provide a computer for just £35. (But remember you will also need an internet connection, typically costing about £20 a month).

Letter - How to Save on Telephone Calls

'If you are a BT customer, or to a lesser extent Virgin and others, it is possible to cut the cost of your telephone calls to near zero. You need to use pre-dial, which involves dialling in an extra code first. To sign up as a customer with one of the pre-dial firms, you have to have at least a basic computer, or someone who can operate one for you, and a credit card.

If you have a computer on broadband you can make even cheaper calls using SKYPE, always providing the person you are calling has a computer. Such calls are free.

Another way is to use the website 'Say No to 0870' (www.saynoto0870.com) which enables you to avoid high charges for special telephone numbers. These can be combined with pre-dial.

Most telephone providers now offer periods of free or low cost calls (usually at times when they are of least use to you). It is worth checking because these arrangements are usually confusing'.
