

6oz (150g) S R Flour 1oz (25g) Margarine

4oz (100g) Lancashire grated cheese

1 egg beaten

A little milk

Pinch of salt

Pinch of Cayenne pepper

#### Method

Mix the flour and margarine until it resembles coarse bread crumbs. Add cheese, pinch of salt and pinch of Cayenne pepper and mix. Add egg with just enough milk to make soft and pliable dough. Roll out onto a lightly floured board. And cut into rounds using 3" pastry cutter. Place on a greased baking tray, brush with beaten egg and bake for about 20 minutes Gas mark 7 (200C/425F). **Display 5 on a plate.**

### **RULES**

- Entry forms MUST be given to any Committee member or handed in at the Trading Hut by Wednesday 28th August 2013, together with entry fees. NO ENTRY FORMS accepted after this time except Class 8 one Specimen Rose. Children's and Schools' Classes are free to enter. All other Classes 20p per exhibit.
- 2. Exhibits—no restriction on entries EXCEPT for Cookery Classes and Flower Arranging Classes which will only be **one** entry per class.
- 3. No exhibit to be removed until after the trophy presentation at 4.00pm. PLEASE REMEMBER THE PRODUCT AUCTION—USE AUCTION CARDS TO INDICATE IF YOU WISH YOUR PRODUCE TO BE AUCTIONED—proceeds from the auction go towards our nominated charity.
- Judges' decisions are final. Any protest must be delivered in writing not later than 3.00pm on the day of the show. **Verbal protest will not be considered.**
- 5. Prize monies to be collected from the Treasurer after 4.15pm.
- 6. No unauthorised person will be allowed to interfere in any way with the exhibits.
- 7. Exhibits may be staged Friday night between 6 pm and 8 pm and Saturday morning between 8.30 am and 10.30 am at which point the hall will be cleared of all exhibitors for judging to take place. Judges stewards will not be exhibitors.
- 8. Only vases belonging to the society will be used **except** in flower arranging classes.
- 9. Each exhibitor must complete a separate entry form.
- 10. In the case of a tied result the award will be made to the exhibitor with the highest number of 1st places.
- 11. Any matter not covered by these rules shall be referred to the committee whose decision shall be final. The committee shall consist of the show Secretary and any two officers.

#### 98 Date and Walnut Loaf

1st 2nd 3rd £1 75p 50p

#### **Ingredients**

8 ozs (250g) dates, cut up in a bowl

4 ozs (125g) sugar

1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

Pinch of salt

1 teacup of boiling water

8 ozs(250g) self raising flour

2 ozs (75g) chopped walnuts

#### Method

Add the sugar to the dates in the bowl, with the bicarbonate of soda and the salt.

Pour the teacup of boiling water over the above, and mix well together.

Add the self-raising flour, and the walnuts, and mix again.

Divide into 2 loaf tins.

Bake in a moderate oven for 45 minutes at 180C (350F) (Gas 4)

#### 99 Shortbread Fingers Ingredients

1st 2nd 3rd £1 75p 50p

4oz (125g) butter

2oz (55g) caster sugar

6oz (180g) plain flour

#### Method

Heat the oven to 190C/375F/Gas 5.

Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth.

Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste. Turn on to a work surface and gently roll out until the paste is 1cm/½in thick.

Cut into fingers and place onto a baking tray. Sprinkle with caster sugar and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes.

Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes, or until pale golden-brown. Set aside to cool on a wire rack.

Display 6 fingers on a plate

4oz (100g) S.R. Flour

4oz (100g) Caster Sugar

4oz (100g) Butter

11h Iar Chutney

2 Eggs

#### Method

Cream butter and sugar with a wooden spoon to a consistency of whipped cream. Beat in each egg separately. Fold in sifted flour with metal spoon or spatula.

Divide mixture between two greased and lined sandwich tins. Bake for 25 minutes at Gas mark 4 (350F/175C). Remove cake from tins and cool on a rack. When cold sandwich together with jam. The dredging of sugar is permitted. (This quantity is suitable for 7" tin or metric equivalent).
