Safety and security in the park

Occasionally some park users are a nuisance to others or cause damage to the park. Recent incidents include damage to the playground equipment, especially swings, by dogs (dogs are not allowed in this area at any time), graffiti, people riding motor vehicles, and the usual littering and fly-tipping. Please help keep the park safe by reporting any incidents as follows:

Non-emergency:

- Please report any vandalism, anti-social behaviour or suspicious activity to the Thornton Heath Safer Neighbourhoods team on 020 8721 2058, or to the 24hour non-emergency police number 101 to report less urgent crime and disorder or to speak to your local officers.
- Fly-tipping, litter, graffiti and general damage to the park: Croydon Council 020 8726 6000 or 'Report It' on www.croydon.gov.uk

Emergency: always call 999.

Please let the Friends know if there are repeated problems – we have good relationships with the council and Safer Neighbourhood team and work with them to make Grangewood Park a safe place for everyone.

Playground red alert
