

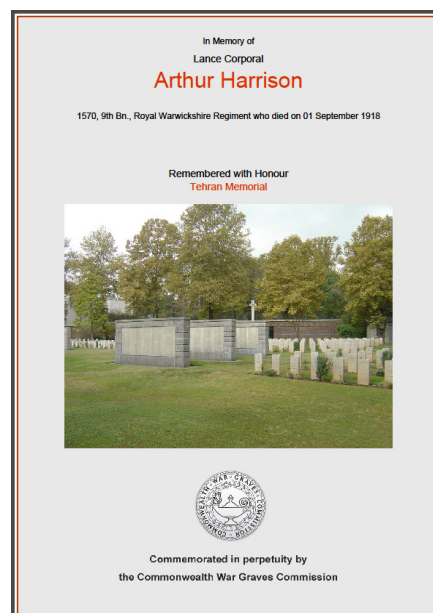
## Arthur Charles Harrison

Arthur's connections with Moreton Morrell have not been established in this research despite the entry in the Warwickshire Roll of Honour which lists him as the "Arthur Harrison" on the Moreton Morrell Memorial.

The Roll records show that he was the son of Charles, a plumber and Phoebe Harrison who lived at 62 Sand Street Warwick and that he was born in 1897. The 1911 Census shows the same couple living in Pickard Street, Warwick and that Charles was a builder's labourer.

Arthur Charles Harrison is reported by the Warwickshire Roll of Honour as having enlisted in Warwick and being a resident of Warwick. He was a Lance Corporal with the 9<sup>th</sup> (Service ) Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment, 39<sup>th</sup> Brigade, 13<sup>th</sup> (Western) Division (army no 1570).

His unit appears to have gone to Egypt after Gallipoli and was then moved to Iran.



It has not been possible to establish a likely battle when he lost his life. He is reported as having been killed in action on 1 September 1918 and is commemorated on the Tehran Memorial, Iran.
