

ARTHUR ROSE

1899 – 1918

Arthur Rose was born in the first quarter of 1899 in Loxley, Warwickshire, the eldest son of Frank & Louisa Rose (nee Lampitt) of Loxley. Arthur's father Frank was a carpenter.

He was a private in the 2nd battalion of the Royal Inniskilling Fuseliers, No. 45152 but died on 15th October 1918 aged 19 and is Remembered with Honour at Dadizeele New British Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. He was awarded the Victory & British medals.

Unfortunately Frank, died on the 1st of November 1918 just fourteen days before his son's death.
