

## Alfred Joseph Ferraro

Joe Ferraro was residing as a boarder in the home of Francis Dee, Moreton Morrell at the time of the 1911 Census. He was age 19 and working as a gardener.

He was apparently known locally for his cricketing abilities.

During the war he served in the Royal Artillery and achieved the rank of Bombardier. His medal record showed he went to the Western Front in July 1915. He was awarded the Military Medal but so far we have not ascertained the circumstances.

He was wounded in the head by shrapnel in July 1916 and the war office records show he was unconscious for seven hours. After a month in hospital he was given three months to recover before further active service.

In November 1917 he was transferred to India and eventually left the army in March 1920.

His life after the army is not known.

This is a provisional report and further research is pending.
