Edward Charles Fitzgerald

Edward was the son of James and Mary Fitzgerald. The 1901 Census shows the family living in Emily Street, Keighley. James occupation is shown as being an army pensioner and he is age 40. Mary is 32. Edward is the second oldest at age 10. His sister also called Mary is 14 and the eldest. There are three younger brothers. Patrick is one of them and he is 5.

James and Mary were born in Cork and Kildare, Ireland respectively. Edward and his sister were both born in Bombay, India presumably whilst James was serving there.

By the time of the 1911 Census, ten years later, Edward and his younger brother Patrick are living at Morton Paddox and are described as servants. Edward is a Chauffeur and Patrick is a groom. Presumably they were employed by Robert Emmet and his wife Louise, the owners, of Moreton Paddox.

It was reported in the Leamington Courier that Edward had joined the $10^{\rm th}$ Hussars in 1914. Unfortunately no information can found about his subsequent army service.

Edward died in December 1961. He had married Gladys May Harris in 1934. He appears to have settled in Warwick.
