

## **GEORGE ALBERT HIRONS**

**George was the third Hirons brother to die.**

**He was born in 1881, in Heathcote, Warwick, the eldest son of Joseph and Sarah Hirons. He was attending Combrook School in 1891, but is not on the local census in 1901.**

**In 1911 he was living at 7 Combrook with his wife, Mary Ann, and 3-year-old son, Ronald. He was working as a bricklayer's labourer.**

**He married Mary Ann Tarver of Ashorne at Newbold Pacey in 1907. She is buried in Ashorne Churchyard and George is mentioned on her headstone.**

**He enlisted in Warwick as a Private in the 11<sup>th</sup> Royal Warwickshire Regiment.**

**He was killed on 25th September 1917, aged 36, in Flanders.**

**He received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal and is buried in the Godewaersvelde British Cemetery, I G 34.**
