

JOHN MARSHALL

**Private, 1ST battalion,
Royal Warwickshire Regiment,
10th Brigade, 4th Division.**

Killed in action at during the Battle of St. Julien on Sunday, 30th April, 1916.

John Marshall was born in Ettington in 1895-6, the youngest of three boys. His parents were John Henry Marshall, a farm labourer originally from Whatcote, and Alice nee Mumford. In 1911 he too was engaged in farm work. At this time only he and his father were at home. They lived in a cottage near the White Horse. We do not know the whereabouts at that time of his mother or eldest brother. His other brother Henry had died the previous year.

John's father was a first cousin of Frederick and John Henry Coldicott, two of the Ettington men killed during the war.

He is buried in the Bienvilliers Military Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France.
