JOSEPH HENRY HIRONS

Joseph was the second of the Hirons brothers to die.

He was born in 1882 in Heathcote, Warwick and was the second son of Joseph and Sarah Hirons. He was attending Combrook School at the time of the 1891 census and was living in Combrook, with his parents, in 1901, when he was working as a gardener.

He married Ethel Maud in about 1910 and they had a daughter, Ivy. In 1911 he was living at 44 Combrook with his wife and daughter and working as a general labourer.

He enlisted in Rugby, as a Private in the 11th Royal Warwickshire Regiment and was killed in action on 10th April 1917, aged 35, in the Western European Theatre.

He received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Bay 3.


