

## Frederick Newbury

Fred was the son of Frederick and Ellen Newbury who in 1891 were living in Walton. Frederick, his father, was employed as a groom and had been born in Bardon, Leicestershire. Ellen had been born in Wellesbourne. Fred was born in Walton around 1886.

By 1901 the census shows that he was lodging in Newbold Pacey at the home of Edwin Fletcher a retired farmer. He was working as a groom at the age of 15. In 1911 he had moved to live at the home of Robert and Louise Emmet where he is employed as a "Oddman" (This term from the Victorian era refers to someone who assists the footman in his household duties)

When the Great War came Fred is mentioned in the Leamington Courier has having joined he Royal Army Medical Corp as a private.

There is no further information discovered about his war service but from the Medal Index record it seems that he served on active service.

Also we have not been able to find trace of Fred after the war.
