Mechanical and structural repairs and maintenance including millstone dressing

At Burwell Mill and Wicken Corn Mill

Lunch provided

Participants will receive tuition from a professional millwright and windmiller on a range of aspects of repairs specific to a working mill. You can also try your hand at traditional millwrighting techniques such as millstone dressing, cap roof works, machinery maintenance and the day-to-day operation of a windmill.

Thursday 23 May 10am-4pm

Safety in maintenance and working at heights – intermediate level

At Impington Mill

Lunch provided

A unique training opportunity with Impington Mill's expert owner and restorer, Steve Temple, to learn about the planning and safe performance of windmill repair and maintenance, particularly to inaccessible external walls, cap, sails and fantail.

Participants will receive an introduction to safe working at height using rope access techniques, and tuition on working from ground level using ladders, tools and equipment. For those keen to put skills into practice, this day is preparation for the hands-on maintenance day on 25 June.

Timber frame and weatherboarding repairs. Lime render and stonework repairs. Window repair and installation

A day for those with an interest in historic building conservation to learn more about traditional craft skills. Tuition will be provided by professional contractors working on the windmill's clunch tower and by the project's conservation architect.

You will develop your understanding of key techniques in the repair of structural timber and masonry and observe conservation work in progress. These techniques are applicable to a wide range of historic buildings.

An opportunity to put into practice the skills learned on the intermediate training day on 23 May and experience hands-on maintenance of a windmill. The day focuses on the preparation of tools and equipment and the safe performance of repairs and maintenance to windmills – particularly the inaccessible external walls, cap, sails and fantail.

You will gain practical experience of safe working at height under supervision using rope access techniques, and tuition on working from ground level using appropriate ladders, tools and equipment.
