What is the purpose of the study?

Our ultimate aim is to develop employability workshops tailored to students with ASD. To achieve this we aim to explore the employability support needs of undergraduate students with ASD at the University of Portsmouth. In particular, we wish to identify how the cognitive profile associated to ASD (i.e., sensory issues, social and communication ability) link to employability factors known to enhance employment success.

Why have I been invited?

You have been invited to take part because either, you are an undergraduate student with ASD registered at the university or, if you do not have a diagnosis of ASD, because you are in the same course and year that one of the participants with ASD that has taken part on the study.

Do I have to take part?

No, taking part in this research is entirely voluntary. It is up to you to decide if you want to volunteer for the study. We will describe the study in this information sheet. If you agree to take part, we will then ask you to sign the attached consent form.

What will happen to me if I take part?

If you decide to take part in this study we will send you a link to an online questionnaire. You will then be asked to register your consent to taking part on the study. A pilot study has shown that the questionnaire takes between 30-45 minutes. You can complete the questionnaire at your own pace and in different sessions if you wish. Your response must be submitted by the 15th of February 2016. Once you complete the questionnaire, you will be given instructions on how to claim your amazon voucher.

Expenses and payments

As a thank you for participating in this study you will receive an amazon voucher worth £10, on completion and submission of the survey questionnaire.

What measurements will be taken?

The study consists of an online questionnaire with two sections, one relating to the cognitive profile associated to ASD (e.g., social and communication ability, sensory issues and flexibility) and another questionnaire about employability factors (e.g., confidence in job search outcomes, self-perceived employability). There are no wrong or right answers to the questions.

What are the possible disadvantages and risks of taking part?

There are no risks identified with participating in this study. Completing the questionnaire takes 30 to 45 minutes. You will be able to complete it entirely at your own pace and on different sessions. If you feel the questionnaire is too long and decide not to complete, you may stop at anytime and we will destroy all data collected until that point.

What are the possible benefits of taking part?

The outcomes of this study will benefit adolescents and young adults with ASD. Data collected will directly inform the design of workshops to enhance employment prospects of adolescents and young adults with ASD. No research to date has directly investigated the relationship between cognitive characteristics associated to ASD (e.g. sensory issues, flexibility) and employability factors (e.g., confidence in job outcomes, self-perceived employability) known to have a positive influence on employment prospects. Identifying which aspects of the cognitive profile link to these employability factors will allow us to develop tailored employability workshops for students with ASD.

Will my taking part in the study be kept confidential?

The raw data, which identifies you by your student number, will be kept securely by the by the Principal Investigator and Alex Tymon in a double-password protected online database. Hardcopies will be kept securely in a locked filing cabinet at the Autism Centre for Employment office. Your student number will be removed once data has been processed and matched.

The data, when made anonymous, may be presented to others at scientific meetings, or published as a project report, academic dissertation or scientific paper or book. It could also be made available to any sponsor of the research. Anonymous data, which does not identify you, may be used in future research studies approved by an Appropriate Research Ethics Committee.

The raw data, which would identify you, will not be passed to anyone outside the study team without your express written permission. The exception to this will be any regulatory authority who may have the legal right to access the data for the purposes of conducting an investigation in exceptional cases.

The raw data will be retained for up to 10 years. When it is no longer required, the data will be disposed of securely (e.g. electronic media and paper records / images) destroyed.

What will happen if I don't want to carry on with the study?

As a volunteer you can stop completing the questionnaire at any time without giving a reason. If you decide not to complete the questionnaire, we will destroy all data collected until that point.
