- Local sports councils offer grants to affiliated clubs:

 - East Ayrshire
 - South Ayrshire
 - North Ayrshire

- <u>Awards for All</u> offer lottery grants between £500 and £10000 (Cannot be used to fund UKCC coaching courses)
