
Projectile Impact

Which is best - PELLET OR BB



And by BEST we don't necessarily mean "the most accurate". To find out which gives the most enjoyment we have set up a two category competition in which you can enter any pellet or BB firing pistol or rifle (a rifle being any gun clearly not intended for single handed use). The targets are also styled more along the military / skirmishing line so you can use the Airsofts if you like.

So the 2 categories are

1. Pellet Firers

(a) Pistol – any calibre, pellet firing. This can include conversions of a commercial BB into a pellet firer e.g. Dan Wesson etc.

(b) Rifle - any calibre, pellet firing.

2. BB Firers

- (a) Pistol any calibre, BB firing.
- (b) Rifle any calibre, BB firing.

All targets are shot from 6 yards and any power source is eligible as long as the course of fire is compatible with it (you could not for instance successfully use a single shot pistol for the rapid fire targets !) You can enter both categories (BB and Pellets) if you wish but no mixing Airsoft pistols with air (pellet) rifles or vice-versa.

The competition will run over two months (the usual TRAINING month followed by a MISSION). There is a total of 4 courses of fire for pistol and 4 courses for rifle and you are allowed to use a different gun for each stage if you wish. If you have access to them, this means you could actually enter 4 different pellet pistols, 4 different pellet rifles, 4 BB pistols and 4 BB rifles. But, again, no mixing of BB with pellet guns – in the final score tables it will be interesting to compare the results for BBs v. pellets.

The final rifle target is a sniper style target for which you are allowed to use telescopic sights if you wish, otherwise all other targets can be engaged with any type of sight EXCEPT A TELESCOPIC SIGHT.

The actual courses of fire for the two months are as below.
