# Community Woodland

The Balloch Community Council woodland was originally bought from the Forestry Commission to create a play area/BMX track in 1991 for the sum of £800. This Community asset runs from the rear of the properties in Forest Drive to the North to the Forestry Commission Path to the South and from the rear of the properties on Culloden Road in the west to a post and wire fence to the East (see Map). Due to local objections to the proposals at the time, it was then decided to change it into a woodland walk and the Army Engineer Corps were enlisted to make the paths through the woodland, including a seated area and steps with handrails at both # south sides.

The woodland is run by the Balloch Woodland Association a body comprising of three members of the Balloch Community Council. Over the years it has deteriorated with the paths, steps and handrails becoming damaged,. The area is also untidy with fly tipping and objects like empty bottles and rubbish. We are now in a position where people with disabilities or mobility issues can no longer use the path safely and if the area is not to deteriorate any further action needs to be taken now.

This is where your views are sought on what we as a community wish to see as the future for this area. Options are; to continue to let the paths and area deteriorate further, to repair the pathways and start to maintain the area, including selective thinning and regeneration, or to offer the woodland for sale to the Forestry Commission who have to be offered first choice or a third party.

The club is attached to the community hall, and offers members 2 full sized tables. The club can be accessed by members using their own key 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

The cost of yearly membership is £15 ordinary membership, age 21 to 65 and £7 for retired individuals aged 65 or over. The cost of the table light is £3 per hour. The tables may be booked for up to 3 hours at a time by means of a booking sheet displayed within the club. Cues are provided if required.

# First Bench at the Hedges

The Hedges is the old main road from the A96 to Balloch which is now no longer accessible to traffic and is mainly used by cyclists and walkers. The community council has undertaken a project to install carved wooden benches along the Hedges. The aims are to provide somewhere for less-able walkers to stop for a rest and to provide incentives for people to exercise there, for example "We'll
