### Albert's Archaeological Roundup

#### East Farleigh

Work is continuing at East Farleigh on Fridays, redrawing the lost plans and cutting a section in the NW corner through the Iron Age ditch at a place where the Roman wall is not built in it so as to obtain a full section. Other trial pits may be dug if time permits. Sale of the property has not yet been confirmed.

The lead scroll revealed nothing so far and is being examined by the Ministry of Defence using sophisticated imagery equipment. The writing on the base of the pot is being examined by Professor Bowman at Oxford (he transcribed the Vindolanda Tablets). Problems with the access code to the gate are being resolved but I think it will be near Easter before weekend digging resumes. The pottery from the site is all washed, marked, sorted and counted. Soil samples have been processed and have produced charred grain. The iron objects are awaiting x-ray; small finds need drawing, and the stone and tile need describing.
