CHAWTON HOUSE LIBRARY GARDENS

Description: Enjoy the peace and tranquillity of these wonderful late 18th century landscape style gardens with lawns, open views across the estate, a lime avenue with distant views across the South lawn to the parkland beyond, wooded area, two terraces, a walled kitchen garden with herb garden, a fernery and shrubbery.

Entrance Fee: £3 per person.

Tea will be on sale in the tea room, for those who so wish, otherwise bring own lunch/drink, as usual.

Parking & Toilets: Toilets and Parking available on site. Park in car park at side of house.

Directions: From Alton take A31 towards Winchester. Turn off Left at A31/32 junction roundabout to Chawton, and follow brown tourist signs.

THURSDAY 14 JUNE 2018 (11am – 4.30pm)

WEST GREEN HOUSE GARDENS

Thakham's Lane, nr Hartley Witney, Hook Hants RG27 8JB

Description: Exquisite gardens of contrast and imagination, created by the Australian garden designer, Marilyn Abbott. There is a grand water staircase leading to the Nymphaeum Fountain, a maginificent walled garden, entered through an arbour of wisteria, an elaborate potager, wonderful perennial borders and beyond these walls, the Lakefield with an eclectic collection of garden follies. The path leads away from the lake to the Paradise Water Garden and contemporary Garden of the Five Bridges and meanders on through a woodland glade to the terraced Theatre Lawn surrounded by tall tapestry hedges.

Cost: Free to National Trust Members; otherwise £8 per person.

Parking & Toilets: Parking, toilets and tea room on site

Directions: From Alton (13.7 miles) take the Basingstoke Road to New Odiham Rd/B3349. Continue on B3349. Take B3016 to Thackham's Lane in Hartley Witney. Turn Left into Thackham's Lane.
