Chairman's Report

How quickly the years fly by! Here we are again, on the verge of our 79th Annual Art Exhibition.

Once more we will have the shortened format of five days. A concentration of excellence!

Our show opens on Wednesday 29th September at 7pm for 7.30pm for the Private View, until 9pm. Then we will be open to the public from Thursday 30th September to Sunday 3rd October, from 10.00am to 5.00pm daily.

Very importantly, the children's Art Competition Prize-Giving will take place on Saturday 2nd October at 11.00am. Excitement amongst the junior element is guaranteed to be intense!

Also enclosed are invitations for you to give to your neighbours and friends, in fact anywhere you feel is appropriate to let people know about our exhibition.

Please indicate your willingness to help on the enclosed exhibition entry form. Invigilation during the show is very important. Instruction and help will be available.

All offers of help for handing in at 9am on Wednesday 29th September and setting up the exhibition will be most welcome.

Gentlemen; once more we call on you to help unload and assemble the 75 screens in the main hall and on the stage for the children's exhibits.

Please note on the Rules of Entry that on the Sunday, we will close the exhibition doors at 5pm. The committee and helpers will

arrange the sold and unsold artworks, check all sales and greeting card sheets and assemble everything in good order.

Then the doors will open from 6pm to 6.30pm for buyers to collect their purchases and pay any amounts outstanding. Artists can also collect all their unsold artworks, including greeting cards.

All items must be checked by the helpers against lists at the exits in the main hall, before leaving the building.

So do come to our 79th Show. Bring family and friends to the Private View at 7pm on Wednesday 29th September. It will be a great evening out, with a fabulous raffle to be drawn at 8.30pm.

Now comes the really important part of my report. Members: we need your exhibits for our show. Have you ever exhibited before? Why not try now! It's often commented by visitors that the Alton Art Show is one of the finest in the South. Let's make this show another of which we can all be very proud.

Directions: From Alton take the A31 into Four Marks, drive through pedestrian crossing at parade of shops, signal and turn immediately right, across hatched area, into 'Station Approach' and drive to end of road. Turn left into Winston Rise, opposite 1st cul-de-sac is number 16.
