

Christmas Tree Festival 2015



Thursday 26th to Sunday 29th November

Following the success of last year's event I am writing to invite you to participate in Rayleigh's second Christmas Tree Festival in Holy Trinity Church, helping to create the sense of awe and wonder and bringing the community together in the spirit of Christmas.

Across Rayleigh, local schools (including Parent Teacher Associations), shops, businesses, charities, clubs and societies are being invited to decorate a Christmas tree. We will provide the trees (approximately 3ft to 4ft in height) and stands, you provide the decorations, which may reflect a theme or your organisation. With space in Holy Trinity Church for up to 40 individually decorated Christmas trees this will be a wonderful opportunity for you to publicise the activities of your group. To coincide with the 'Rayleigh Christmas Light Switching On' the church will be open from 3.00pm until 7.30pm on the 26 November as part of this very enjoyable annual event.

Be creative! If the decorations are home made so much the better. You will be provided with a convenient power point to connect your tree lights. If you could use low energy LED, or battery powered lights, so much the better for our environment, but it's not compulsory! We ask that flashing or musical lights are not used, as these may be distressing to some visitors. You will be asked to contribute £25 towards our costs but at the end of the festival the tree (but not the stand) will become yours to take away. Any uncollected trees will be given to charity or auctioned – please indicate your preference on the booking form.

The Christmas Tree Festival is organised by 'The Friends of Holy Trinity Rayleigh', offering financial assistance to support the ongoing task of repair and renewal of this medieval building. This is the second, or possibly the third, place of worship to stand on this site, where it is likely that Christians have worshipped for over 1000 years!

The trees may be decorated on Wednesday 25 November (between 6.00pm and 10.00pm) and Thursday 26 November (between 9.00am and 2.00pm). The trees can be removed after the service on Sunday 29 November or during the day on Monday 30 November 2014. Your space must be booked and paid for in advance - please indicate your preference on the booking form.

- Christmas Stalls an opportunity to buy Christmas Cards and other quality gifts
- Spirit of Christmas Grotto bring a gift to bring joy to a child in need (Gifts of new or quality second-hand toys or presents are preferred - these will then be wrapped up and delivered to families in Rayleigh)
- Refreshments tea, coffee, soft drinks, mince pies, cakes and biscuits
- Service of Light on Sunday at 4.00pm, followed by refreshments and mince pies in Holy Trinity Church.

Suggested donation of £2.00 to view and vote for your favourite tree. Children under 16 are free.
