

## TheFED Payment Page 29 June 2015

### Methods of paying TheFED for individual or group membership fees , or tickets to the Festival of Writing at Faraday House, or for making donations to TheFED

#### Options

1. Press the **Donate** button on the website [www.thefed.btck.co.uk](http://www.thefed.btck.co.uk) which will direct you to the Paypal payment page, where you can pay any amount securely, either through Paypal, if you have a Paypal account, or with a debit or credit card, if you do not have a Paypal account. You do not need a Paypal account to pay through Paypal, just an email address. This is a secure method of paying over the internet.

2. Send a cheque, made payable to THE FED, in the appropriate sum, to:
