## Watford Live 1<sup>st</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> June 2013

Watford Live started in 2009 with a weekend of music, facepainting, art and dance. It has gradually got bigger and better and now involves many local talented people in a month of art activities from exhibition, dance, theatre and live music. Plans are now under way for activities in the town centre and

local community centres for 2013. The first event is a community fair in Charter Place and DRUM will have a stall. We have also moved the date of our next exhibition to coincide with the festival.

We are now well into our latest art project, inspired by Africa and the Caribbean, which we will continue to work on until the end of May.

As usual, everyone has risen to the challenge brilliantly and have already produced some fantastic work including paintings, masks and collages.

We are now concentrating on making large papier-mâché African animal heads, including elephants, zebras, lions and giraffes......Darren's doing a crocodile!

The shape of the chosen animal's head can be made from chicken wire, balloons or card. It is then covered in Art-roc and further layers of papier-mâché. Pieces of sponge, cardboard or screwed up newspaper can be added to make facial and body features, ears, tails or trunks etc and once dry it can be painted or decorated.

Staff and volunteers will be framing paintings and hanging your work during May, so please ensure that any work that you wish to be exhibited is finished and at the DRUM centre.

The art exhibition will be open at the DRUM centre on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> & Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June. Opening times will be confirmed at a later date.

Members can reserve their work prior to the exhibition and can make a donation towards the costs of art materials. All the remaining artwork will be sold to the public to raise funds for DRUM.

We may also be exhibiting at other locations during June so may need to hold on to some of the work until the end of the month.



## Carnaby Street, the Musical

## Albans Arena, Saturday 15th June, 2.30pm

In the Sixties, Carnaby Street was the place to be, with clothes shops like Gear, Lord John and many more setting the trend for swinging London. The street was always alive with fashion shoppers and the rising stars of a time which was to bring about major social change. A

feeling of hope and freedom was in the air, and many young musicians whose impact is still felt today - such as The Who, the Spencer David Group (featuring Steve Winwood), The Moody Blues and The Yardbirds - were just beginning their careers at The Marquee.

Carnaby Street tells the story of Jude, a singer/songwriter who travels down from Liverpool with his best friend Penny Lane, in search of fame and fortune. A chance encounter with man-about-town Jack Flash leads to Jude joining a band led by 'Wild Thing' at The Marquee Club and with Jack acting as their hopelessly inexperienced manager they try to make it big in the exploding pop/rock scene of the time.
