FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

(on paper plates no bigger than 14" diameter)

- 1. 12 raspberries stalks on
- 2. 3 dessert/eating apples
- 3. 3 cooking apples
- 4. 5 stone fruit
- 5. 1 plate any other fruit
- 6. 3 potatoes white variety
- 7. 3 onions dressed
- 8. 6 shallots dressed
- 9. 6 runner beans (with ½" stalk)
- 10. 6 French beans (with ½" stalk)
- 11. 3 beetroot (round with tops on but cut to 3")
- 12. 3 courgettes
- 13. 1 cabbage (round with 3" of stalk)
- 14. 1 cauliflower (with 3" of stalk)
- 15. Any other vegetable not in the above classes
- 16. 3 sticks rhubarb leaves trimmed to 4"
- 17. 1 lettuce any variety (with whole root system on but washed and roots enclosed in a plastic bag)
- 18. 1 cucumber
- 19. 6 tomatoes with stalk on
- 20. 1 beefsteak tomato with stalk on
- 21. 9 cherry tomatoes with stalks on
- 22. 3 leeks
- 23. 2 parsnips
- 24. 1 marrow not more than 18" long, excluding the stalk
- 25. The longest runner bean
- 26. The heaviest onion dressed
- 27. The heaviest marrow with 2" of stalk
- 28. The heaviest leek complete washed
- 29. A vase of herbs, 3 different kinds, with 3 stems of each

FLOWERS AND POT PLANTS

(note: a stem is an entire stem not just a single flower)

- 30. 1 vase of 3 Cactus dahlias
- 31. 1 vase of 4 Pompon dahlias not over 2" diameter
- 32. 1 vase of 3 roses, dissimilar hybrid tea
- 33. 1 vase of 3 roses clusters/floribunda
- 34. 1 single hybrid tea rose
- 35. 1 vase of hellenium 5 stems
- 36. 1 vase of antirrhinums (same height) 5 stems
- 37 1 vase of cosmos 5 stems

- 38. 1 vase of nicotiana 5 stems
- 39. 1 vase of sweet peas 6 stems 3 varieties
- 40. 1 vase of perennial sweet peas 5 stems
- 41. 1 vase of rudbeckia 5 stems
- 42. 1 vase of echinacia 5 stems
- 43. 1 vase of coreopsis 5 stems
- 44. 1 vase of mixed perennial garden flowers 5 stems
- 45. 1 vase of mixed annuals 5 stems
- 1 vase of flowers (same variety) not mentioned in the schedule 5 stems
- 47. 1 vase of flowers of the same colour 5 stems of different flowers
- 48. 1 jar of sedges and grasses

Plants in classes 49 to 51 should be in a pot not more than 10" diameter

- 49. 1 cactus/succulent
- 50. 1 flowering pot plant
- 51. 1 foliage pot plant
- 52. Pot planted with summer bedding

FLORAL ART

- 53. A Royal Celebration
- 54. New Arrival
- 55. Tea Time
- 56. A Jug of Colour

White niches with hinges will be provided, space allowed for exhibits is 24" high x 19" wide.

Foliage and flowers need not have been grown by the exhibitor Exhibits may be constructed and brought to the village hall. Accessories are allowed.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Exhibitors are restricted to 1 entry per class. Photographs to be no larger than A4 including mount.

Colour

- 57. A sporting scene
- 58. A wildlife photograph
- 59. A landscape
- 60. A person or people
- 61. Fruit(s) and / or flowers
- 62. A garden

ART

- 63. Drawing. Any drawing medium or mixed media e.g. pencil, charcoal, pen, ink etc. -A3 max incl. mount/frame
- 64. Painting. Any painting medium or mixed media e.g. oils, acrylics, watercolours, oil or soft pastels etc. A3 max incl. mount/frame

HANDICRAFTS

- 65. A knitted hat
- 66. A piece of crochet work
- 67. A piece of embroidery of the exhibitor's own design (not from a kit) A3 max
- 68. A bag made in any medium
- 69. Any article of felt work
- 70. A Tea Cosy
- 71. A pin cushion

PRODUCE

(Jars not to weigh more than 1lb)

- 73. 1 jar of raspberry jam
- 74. 1 jar of redcurrant jelly
- 75. 1 jar marmalade
- 76. 1 jar lemon curd
- 77. 1 jar chutney
- 78. 1 bottle of fruit liqueur

All the following classes should be displayed on a white paper plate:

- 79. 8" closed apple pie
- 80. 5 flapjacks
- 81. 8" Bakewell tart
- 82. 4 fruit scones, using a 21/2" cutter
- 83. 4 cheese scones, using a 21/2" cutter
- 84. 3 ginger nuts of equal size
- 85. 3 Shrewsbury biscuits, using a 21/2" cutter
- 86. Carrot Cake using the following recipe:

155ml sunflower oil, 230gm self raising flour, 5gm baking powder, 10gm ground cinnamon, 5gm mixed spice, 5gm ground ginger, 230gm light muscavado sugar, grated rind of a small orange, 100gm pecan nuts coarsely chopped, 260gm coarsely grated carrot, 3 medium eggs

Topping: 50gm butter, 200gm full fat cream cheese, 100gm icing sugar, finely grated zest of small orange.

Method: Grease an 18cm cake tin and line with baking parchment. Sift flour, baking

powder and spices in a bowl. Add sugar, zest, pecans and grated carrot and mix well. Stir in beaten egg and oil and mix well. Bake for 1 hour, fan 160c / 180c / gas mark 4. Turn out and leave to cool.

Prepare topping using half to sandwich the cake and the other half on top.

87. Brown and white bread rolls – 3 of each

MEN ONLY

88. Ginger cake – using the following recipe:

4oz margarine, 4oz caster sugar, 2 beaten eggs, 8oz self raising flour, ½ cup golden syrup, 1 rounded teaspoon each of ground ginger and mixed spice, 1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, ½ cup boiling water.

Method: Cream margarine and sugar, add eggs, syrup, spices and flour. Dissolve bicarbonate of soda in boiling water and add to mixture. Turn into lined loaf tin and bake at 300F / 150C / gas mark 2 for 40 minutes.

Entries in the show are open to anyone living in Bishop Monkton parish, attending Bishop Monkton school or members of Bishop Monkton gardening club (classes 1-56 only)

Entries: - 50p each, children 20p

All entries must be made/grown by the exhibitor unless otherwise stated.

Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish but only ONE entry per class.

All entry forms must be delivered NO LATER THAN 6pm Tuesday 28th August in the post box at Orchard Lodge, Main Street.

All entries to be taken to the village hall between 9.00am and 10.30am on the day of the show. The hall will be cleared for judging at 10.30am prompt.

All exhibitors must provide their own plates and vases (the committee will not be held responsible for any breakages).

Plants in pots must not be watered on the day of the show and must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for not less than three months.

All names on pictures etc. must be covered for judging purposes.

NO ITEMS PREVIOUSLY EXHIBITED AT ANY BISHOP MONKTON PRODUCE SHOW SHOULD BE ENTERED.

First, second and third place prize money and certificates will be awarded and some trophies.

The judge's decision on the merits of any exhibit to be final. The judge may withhold or modify prizes for any entries deemed not up to the required standard.

Points awarded where there is only one entry in any class will not count towards an overall trophy.

The committee shall be empowered to settle any dispute which may arise for which the rules do not provide.

The village hall will be open to the public to view the exhibits from 2.00pm. Admission free. Trophies will be awarded at 3.30pm.

All exhibits to be left in the village hall until after the presentation of prizes after which they can be collected by the exhibitors. Nothing may be removed before that time without the permission of the committee.
