## Music for your Wedding

Music plays an important part in your wedding ceremony and the right choices will do much to enhance the occasion and create the right atmosphere as the service moves through its various stages.

I hope you will find the following suggestions helpful as you plan your special day. At St Mary's we have a very fine organ, a very good set of bells and an excellent choir.

We encourage you, as you have decided to get married here, to make full use of what is available to you and as the Director of Music I would be pleased to advise and help you in your choices of music and hymns/songs.

### 1. Music before the service

As Organist I like to play quiet and reflective music to set the mood of quiet anticipation, unless you would like some special piece. You do not need exciting music yet as that will come with the **ENTANCE OF THE BRIDE**

## 2. Music for the entrance of the Bride

The choice of music here is designed to herald the arrival of the bride, and hence should be triumphant and joyful. The following are ideal pieces for the bridal party to comfortably process down the aisle of the church

### 3. Choice of music during the signing of the Registers
