## **Fort Horsted**

As a result of FHV's on-going liaison with Avondale, the company that manages Fort Horsted, we are currently undertaking a year-long survey of flora and fauna at the site. Several visits have already taken place and numerous species of plants and wildlife have been recorded. Further visits are planned for next spring.

### **Litter Clearance in the Valley**

There have been more litter picks in the Valley over the last couple of months. Firstly, we have been fortunate to attract the services of a group of ATC volunteers. They have already carried out a couple of litter picks, and we are looking at other ways in which they might provide assistance. Secondly, a number of FHV members joined ASDA staff recently for a litter pick that was organised by ASDA Community Life. Areas where litter has now been cleared include the Southern field, Vale Drive playground, and the newly opened Birch Path bordering the BORA playing field. We are hopeful that the clean areas will remain clean as people are less likely to be the first to drop litter where none exists already. With this in mind it would be much appreciated if any members using the Valley for walking or dog-exercising would consider carrying a plastic carrier bag with them to pick up any litter they come across. This would help greatly to maintain a clean Valley.

## **Junior Member Joins Committee**

Henry Worthy, one of our junior members, was recently co-opted onto the Committee to provide a young person's perspective during the committee's deliberations. Henry has already put forward some useful ideas and is proving to be a valuable asset.
