A Trip to the Midlands

Brian Roblett, our former newsletter printer and I visited the NEC for a look at an exhibition of classic cars and motorcycles. This was my first visit to the exhibition centre and we were amazed (and confused) by the scale of it all, especially the car parking arrangements which

were so gigantic that a shuttle bus system is used to reach the vast main building.

The exhibits were provided by various clubs in the area so quite a number displayed mixtures of models from various manufacturers on their stands. Vainly did we look for signs of Hall Green's wares' Triumphs in vast arrays, B.S.A.'s a plenty, even 1920's and 30's BMWs in pristine condition. A one-off pre war AJS straight four cylinder 1000cc prototype courtesy of Sammy Miller's stable stood gleaming in isolation. Almost by accident we eventually discovered a Valiant twin trapped amid Villiers engine lightweights, cyclemotors and a couple of autocycles. At least it was taxed and bore the scars of use. It even retained the pressed steel engine covers which, like rear and prop stands on old machines, usually go AWOL.

The Japs were well represented by several Suzuki 3 cylinder "Kettles" and other oriental machines all of which were very clean all over and well polished. We wondered if they were trailered from show to show and kept in sitting shown, a Norvin twin (1/16th inch clearance between the front exhaust pipe and featherbed frame). Truly, you couldn't spit through it anywhere.

A wall of death was rigged up with much glitter and loud announcements, but did not attract many punters. Much revving, banging and propping was heard from which I believe was an old Indian Twin, but it made a nice change to the usual pop (no pun) music, crusty soul that I am. We did not visit the car displays as it was an extra £8.50 and was took their toll on the time with 50 and 60 limits on the way home.



The Velocette Viceroy Hovercraft



Around 121 Hoverhawks were manufactured during 1969 - 1971 at their Peterborough factory with the aid of Government funding.

It was the first Hovercraft in its class to be placed into production.

Costing around the same as a small house - this iconic two seat craft was sold to all kinds of industry and rich individuals around the world.

The first MKI craft were to employ three Velocette Viceroy 15hp engines - which proved to be unsuited for the application.

The design was modified and improved through its production life ending with the MKIII which employed three SACHS Wankel Rotary engines each producing 21hp.


Dorking Centre Regalia.


