Proposed Activities 2012:

- Further work on site is needed including our contribution to the road repairs. It was agreed that we need to cap our contribution to this because of recent flood damage, but it will be beneficial if we can have the site entrance tarred as part of the overall works for which we will require to pay the full cost. Need to discuss further with the other road owners. A quotation has been requested from Forsters Contractors, hopefully this will be presented at the next meeting.
- Insurance renewed with BTCV for public liability and tools insurance. The tractor will be insured with NFU and will continue to be stored at Millend Garage. Kenny was hoping to complete further compost turning and tractor has not yet been moved indoors at the Garage. Trailer needs to be taken to Brechin for servicing this requires a volunteer with a towbar to be identified.
- The 2013 Calendar to be printed and distributed before April.
- Need to re-apply for SEPA Licence in February.
- In addition to the normal Beach Cleans it was proposed that an additional informal one is carried out on Saturday 19th January at 11am because of the storm, working northwards from the Narrows. There will be no skip and no recording of litter. It was also suggested that in general dog walkers and other interested parties could assist on an informal basis to help clear the Coastal Path.
- In relation to general clean-up activity, Niall Young noted the Community Council's involvement with Aberdeenshire Council and the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers regarding environmental improvements to the Village area, and that the BTCV in particular had offered assistance in improving the appearance of the compost site, e.g. in painting the container and rebuilding the wall. Niall will liaise on behalf of SHARK.
- Current volunteer numbers are 24, with 2 new participants replacing some lost from last year. There are 39 homes signed up for the composting collections so far this year.
