Everything in the park has started to grow and we are starting to see a lot of our summer migrants appearing around the site, including:


**Chiffchaffs,**

The Ecology company that carried out surveys for Lizards last autumn are now back in the park moving yet MORE Lizards and Grass snakes onto the park from the development site behind Tesco's. They are also seeing how many of the Lizards that were moved last year have survived the winter in their new Hibernacula's around the park. If you see people around with clipboards and roofing felt, you'll know who they are! We've also had quite a large 'dose' of Tadpoles this year in the wet scrapes around the park. Hopefully, a large proportion of these will help increase Frog populations!

## Volunteers Galore.....

The winter has seen quite a few volunteer work parties in the park undergoing various activities to improve the site.

Mid-February saw the first of our “Friends of Barford Road Pocket Park” work parties. About 10 volunteers turned up to help plant a number of small trees in the Tesco's end of the park, and 4 very large Field Maple trees. A couple of weeks after this, another work party planted about 200 hedging plants at the school end of the park. So far (touch wood), these trees are all growing successfully and will hopefully form a nice hedge, which in about 10 years, can be laid. This is a traditional method of managing hedges. It involves cutting through the base of the each tree, leaving it attached with about 1/3 of the trunk, and laying it over. If done correctly, the hedge will sprout from the base again, causing the hedge to thicken up and become a good nesting habitat for birds. Years ago, farmers used hedging to keep livestock in fields instead of fencing!!



## Eynesbury Manor Residents Association.

A few months ago, I received an email informing me of the “folding” of the Eynesbury Manor Residents Association (EMRA). The chairman was moving away and because of lack of interest in someone volunteering to become the new one, the decision was taken to fold the group. This was a bit of a blow to me as EMRA was a main link between me/the park and the residents of the estate. The good news out of this is that EMRA had some money left over in their kitty which they kindly decided to give to me to install a new bench in the park. This bench has now been installed and you can see it near the play area!
