Over the past few weeks the workmen have been very busy constructing a number of paths from the Eynesbury end of the bridge in different directions. There is a path towards the caravan site, towards the school and most importantly, towards the park. Work has then continued through the park towards the A428 by-pass.

At the start of the work in the park I was a bit worried about the quality of the path being laid down, but I held my breath and in the end the contractors have done a fantastic job. The main path through the park (alongside the marina), is now suitable for walking on, pushing buggies and wheelchairs on, and cycling on. The new improved surface SHOULD also solve the annual issue of wet and muddy paths! I hope this will now provide a good
