

DECC Local Energy Assessment Fund

A new £10 million fund announced by DECC today presents an exciting new opportunity for community energy projects.

What is the funding for?

In summary, the fund will provide support for communities to:

- 1. Commission assessments of the energy efficiency of homes and buildings in their community
- 2. Run demonstration projects of the type of measures that will shortly be available through the Green Deal (e.g. solid wall insulation)
- 3. Carry out feasibility studies for community renewable energy projects
- 4. Run public awareness-raising and engagement events and meetings to ensure that the whole community (a) understands the reasons for your group engaging in this work (b) has access to the findings of any studies and (c) is given the opportunity to get involved

In order to apply for funds to carry out feasibility studies for renewable energy projects, communities will need to show that they have, or will (during the period of the funding) carry out work under points (1) and (4). Communities do not have to do all of this work themselves – average grants under this fund are expected to be around £50,000 up to a maximum of £130,000, and this can be used to pay specialist organisations for support.

Why is the government providing this funding?

The reason for the fund is to give communities a head start on the possibilities that are opening up through: the Green Deal¹ (improving homes), the payments that will be available through the Renewable Heat Incentive (heat generating renewable energy technologies), and encouraging take up of technologies that benefit from the Feed in Tariff (electricity generating renewable energy technologies).

The funding will be available for any legally incorporated not-for-profit groups — including voluntary groups, Parish Councils, CICs, Co-ops and Communities of Interest. In some cases a legally incorporated non-profit group such as a local charity will be able to represent an un-constituted community group by acting as a lead organisation. In exceptional cases public sector bodies may be accepted as lead bodies where they can justify that they are fulfilling a crucial role in support of a community group.

What are the deadlines?

The funding will be issued in two phases. In phase 1, bids will need to be submitted to DECC by 12 Noon 22nd December 2011 and successful groups will be announced in the week beginning 9th Jan

2012. In phase 2, bids need to be submitted by 12 Noon 20th Jan 2012, and successful groups will be announced by 31st Jan, 2012. Work will need to be completed by 31st March 2012.
