The building of trust is essential to any relationship and sadly we are just waking up to the fact that big business cannot be trusted when it comes to food. Organisations like transition are making it easier for people like us to connect with local people and to communicate who we are.

We came to the market in the hope of meeting local people and talking to them about our veg box scheme and the philosophy behind it. We are determined to make a positive and sustainable impact on local food supply and actually talking to people, face to face, is an important aspect of the process. It allows us the opportunity to show people our produce and to communicate how we operate and why we think it's important. Conversely it allows our customers to put a face to our name and to see that we are real, local people.



The Market for us was a success; we picked up a few new customers and managed to introduce ourselves to a lot of local people. People who will now know who The Veg Men are and what we are about.

We are now 2 months in to our veg box scheme. After taking the first 6 weeks slowly we have recently advertised the

scheme and are now covering everywhere between Chester, Frodsham and Tarporley. We have 9 active customers in the Frodsham area and we're looking forward to the New Year and a big push to pick up more.

Soup workshop at Kelsall Primary









We run a scheme with several local schools, allowing them to act as a veg box pick up point for staff and parents. For every box delivered in this way we donate £1 to the school. Working with schools in this way allows us to foster meaningful links that are mutually beneficial. As a result further collaboration is inevitable.

At the beginning of the month we spent the day cooking soup with the students at Kelsall primary; they made parsnip and apple soup and Borscht, using our local produce. In the afternoon we served it up to their parents whilst the pupils listed the ingredients and explained how they cooked it!

Promoting healthy eating and affecting social change are two of our four founding principles. The day was a huge success and we were delighted to see the enthusiasm the students showed for working with and eating fresh vegetables and fruit. We expect to be running the same workshops in both Kingsley St John and Tarporley C of E, sometime in January.
