#### **Dear Parishioners**

In response to the Covid-19 outbreak in the UK and in the event that it is not possible to convene a meeting of the council in a reasonable time all planning applications will be emailed to Parish Councillors within 72 hours of receipt.

The clerk will gather Councillors comments by email and share an agreed response which will be sent to EDDC planning within the planning deadline date. The clerk will also post the planning applications on the PC page of the village website, and Notice Boards to make residents aware of the applications

Any comments can be emailed to the Parish Clerk who will forward these to parish councilors for consideration. This is to enable council business to continue. Any decisions taken during this period are to be formally approved at the first council meeting following the emergency measures. The Parish Council will also be working closely with District Councillors and EDDC to ensure best practice in these difficult circumstances.

If you do not have access to the internet the Royal Mail postal service is continuing to operate.

#### From Revd Nigel, Associate Priest:

It gives us great pleasure to share the news that the new Vicar, Revd Bill Lemmey, is to be Instituted on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> July to the White Cross Mission community (that is, the parishes of Aylesbeare, Clyst St George, Clyst St Mary, Farringdon, Woodbury with Exton, Woodbury Salterton). We welcome Bill and his wife Daff to our villages, from the parishes of Porlock, Selworthy and Luccombe in the diocese of Bath and Wells, where they have been since 2009.

Bill was Ordained in the Diocese of Winchester in 2005 ( as deacon) and in 2006 (as priest). He studied theology at Westcott House, Cambridge and currently is in his third year of studying part-time at Sarum College (Salisbury) for an MA in Christian Spirituality, with an emphasis on poetry.

Before studying for Ordination Bill read a degree in maths and obtained a PGCE so he taught briefly in Oxford and Bedford. He then became a youth worker in Bournemouth and ran a family centre in Taunton. He became a church youth worker before opening second-hand bookshops in Crewkerne and Lyme Regis.

Bill's hobbies are walking and praying (he participated in the diocesan pilgrimage from Yeovil to Glastonbury, whilst in 2016 he undertook a personal pilgrimage from the parish of Porlock to Holy Island, Lindisfarne). Bill loves to read, for he was a specialist in selling Penguin editions and is interested in crime fiction.

Prayer, people and community are all important to Bill in his ministry and sharing the Gospel in love (with the image of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10) with "mission in whatever you do." We look forward to meeting and getting to know Bill and Daff and am sure they shall be given a warm welcome.

### Our church buildings are open for private prayer!

Alongside government advice and directions from the Church of England, the churchwardens have produced risk assessments and wisely, acting cautiously, have decided to open churches at designated times on specific days, with Woodbury Salterton (Mondays 3-6pm); Woodbury (Wednesdays 1am-1pm); Farringdon (Thursdays 2-5pm); Clyst St George (Fridays 4-7pm); Clyst St Mary (Saturdays 10am-1pm) and Exton (Sundays (2-5pm). All of this is kept under Review (so times may be extended or varied); sadly at this time of writing services are not permitted within the buildings – but we wait for further government advice!

# **CHURCH OPENING**

As Revd Nigel has said, Farringdon Church is now open for private prayer between 2pm and 5pm on Thursday afternoons. You are asked to use the sanitizer provided before and after entering the church. At present only the back of the church is accessible for use and the Church will be locked for the rest of the week.

As you will probably be aware, the government is allowing church services from the beginning of July. Advice on how this can be carried out is still awaited and any further news on this will be given on facebook and through the village and Mission community webpages.

#### THE PLAY LAST YEAR



July will not be the same this year as the Farringdon Society of Arts <u>www.fsadevon.btck.co.uk</u> will not be bringing the Cygnet training theatre to perform in the village.

Each year for the last five years audiences have been entertained by this fabulous troupe of players.

Due to the current lockdown the actors have not been able to meet and there have been too many challenges to protect with safeguarding policies.

We have sent a heartfelt message to the Cygnet group that we will miss them and hope that the company will survive the difficult days to come.

Stella Mew, former CEO of the Yeats Society who has supported the FSA over the last 15 years and has always joined us from Ireland to attend the play sent some words of hope for the future of cultural activities 'the arts are a great social leveller... We don't have to be wealthy to know how to enjoy a painting or listen to music or read a book . It is good to remember that it is the creativity that matters and where creativity comes first very often the money will follow '.

As the arts become economically threatened please remember the research from Arts& Health South West which we shared in 2014 when we held the 10th anniversary of the FSA that 'where the arts are valued in a community, people on average live up to ten years longer and mental health statistics are lower.' What is even more interesting is that the evidence shows that the benefits are for everyone even those who don't even attend an event or get involved at all. In other words just living in a community where the arts are valued the benefits are for everyone! Hope to see some of you next year. Meanwhile keep strong and be creative! Janet

### Link between LittlePod and Madagascar

"Janet has been doing some detective work and has found a link between LittlePod and Madagascar – and it has nothing to do with vanilla!"

Those familiar with our location and our scenic surroundings here in East Devon will no doubt recognize our village church, St Petrock & St Barnabas. There has been a church here for centuries, but the current building was reconstructed in Victorian times. The architect responsible was called William White, most renowned for the reconstruction of Bishops Court in Clyst St Mary, the village next to us.





Nothing usual in this perhaps, but Janet has just discovered that William also designed the rather striking St Lawrence Anglican Cathedral in Antananarivo, the capital of Madagascar, from where, of course, we source the real vanilla that goes into our natural paste and pure bourbon extract.

Both churches boast fascinating histories and, having forged such a strong relationship with Madagascar and its people during our first decade in business, we're amazed to find that such a link existed long before our time. It just goes to show that meaningful connections can always be found if you look hard enough."

Now here is a story for lovers of the TV programme 'Who do you think you are?'

Further research was needed to investigate who funded the reconstruction of Farringdon church. We discovered that it was a

man named John Garratt. John Garratt was the Lord Mayor of London (he laid the cornerstone of London Bridge). He was a Goldsmith. He purchased Bishops Court when it had 1200 acres including Farringdon. His son John Garratt Jnr went to Madagascar with the Duke of York on a trade mission where gold was in abundance. It was decided to set up a Bishopric in Madagascar and the first Bishop was to be from Cornwall.

John Garratt Senior married a second wife called Sarah D'Oylyn Aplin. Sarah's brother was Christopher D'Auvergne Aplin.Their father was Admiral Peter Aplin. In fact the familytree traces back five further Peter Aplin's.

Why would this be of any relevance to Farringdon? Well it isn't directly. However, the LittlePod company has recently inaugurated its first CEO whose name is Olly D'Auvergne Aplin! What a shocker! Is it something in the water that has drawn him here? Olly is indeed descended from Admiral Aplin and his grandfather was Peter D'Oylyn Aplin.

Sometimes truth is stranger than fiction. Who would have thought, least of all Olly himself, that as he sits in the despatch room looking at Farringdon church, his ancestors would have seen the same view and that it had been funded by gold from Madagascar? Olly may be a newby in Farringdon but Olly is probably more historically connected to Farringdon than anyone else who lives here!

# Household vans able to use recycling centres

<u>Restrictions at our recycling centres have eased again this week</u>, so personal vans are now allowed to bring household waste as long as it's only the same amount that would fit in a normal sized family car or trailer.

This is so we can make sure our centres have enough capacity to serve as many people as possible and keep unloading times to a minimum.

Three of our recycling centres are particularly busy, so in order to manage demand and keep queues to a manageable level you'll <u>need to book a</u> <u>time slot online</u> if you want to visit Exton Road (Exeter), Pinbrook Road (Exeter) and Brunel Road (Newton Abbot) in your van.

Unfortunately, vans can't be accommodated at the Totnes and South Molton (Maclins Quarry) sites due to their size.



## New face covering journey assistance cards

Stagecoach is encouraging passengers who are unable to wear a face covering on the bus due to a health condition or a disability to apply for new 'face covering journey assistance cards' to show to drivers when they board to confirm they are exempt from the legislation.

There is also a special card available if you need the driver to lower their face covering because you are hearing impaired and need to lip read.

Once you've filled in the application form, Stagecoach will email you a card that you can save to your phone and show to the driver when you get on the bus - or you can download and print your card. If you don't have a smartphone or printer, <u>please contact your local team</u> and they'll arrange for a printed card to be sent to you.
