
RESULTS FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE


Between September 2011 and February 2012, the Borders Broadband project conducted a survey into demand for faster broadband among households in Gloucestershire. The survey is based on 5.960 completed questionnaires – here are some headline results:

Nearly all Gloucestershire households have access to the internet at home

Most of these are dissatisfied with their internet speed (Fig 1)

A third of households with internet use it for school, college or university studies. Six out of ten use the internet at home for work, either for their employer, to run a business, or both (Fig 3)






Most experience sluggish internet service at certain times of day. Nearly half (47%) regularly lose their connection



Nearly all of these households would like high-speed internet in the future



Nearly half of households reported having download speeds below 2 Mbps (Megabits per second) - the minimum broadband speed the Government savs should be available to every UK home or business. Around one in four households have speeds below 1 Mbps (Fig 2)









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RESULTS FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE (CONTINUED)











More than half of households spend over 20 hours per week on the internet at home (collectively as a household)



Top three uses for the internet at home are:

- searching for goods and services
- using email
- buying goods and services



Top three desired uses if they had high-speed internet are:

- online radio/TV/films/videos
- video communication (e.g. Skype)
- downloading music/photos/ graphics







A similar survey of businesses in Gloucestershire and Herefordshire generated 1,512 responses. It found that:



Around one in six businesses have broadband download speeds of **less than 0.5 Mbps**. (The national average is 7.6 Mbps)



Nearly half of businesses have download speeds well below 2 Mbps – the minimum broadband speed the Government says should be available to every UK home or business



Six out of ten businesses are either very dissatisfied or dissatisfied with their current internet service



Most rate the need for faster internet as 'very important'
