PLEASE NOTE THE SHOW RULES

- 1. All entry forms and fees, in a sealed envelope, to reach The Schedule Secretary Mrs. Stephanie Collier at Crudens Farm Cottage, Ashleworth, GL19 4HT (tel. 700667) by 8pm on Friday 31st August 2018. Electronic entries, via the village website (www.ashleworth.btck.co.uk) must be received by 5pm on Friday 31st August 2018 with fees to be paid on the day details in the final programme. Entries will NOT be accepted on the day of the Show.
- 2. One entry form per exhibitor.
- 3. Exhibits to be staged between 9.15 am and 10.45 am on the morning of the Show.
- 4. Exhibits must not be removed from the Show Tables before 4.30 pm. They should be removed by 5.30pm at latest or could be discarded.
- 5. Exhibitors may not receive more than one prize in any one class, but can enter more than one exhibit in any class.
- 6. Previous prize-winning entries may not be resubmitted.
- 7. All entries must be the Exhibitor's own work.
- 8. Entries in Class F, Produce and Flowers, must be home grown by the Exhibitor.
- 9. A maximum of two prizes per class may be awarded, plus additional 'highly commended' certificates at the judge's discretion.
- 10. The judge's decision is final.
- 11. Entry Fees:

Adults - 50p Under 18s - 20p per entry.

All children aged 11 and under may enter an adult section for an entry fee of 20p but they must **NOT** state their age (except class C24).

12. Cash prizes must be collected on the day of the Show from the Treasurer's hut/tent/caravan.

The Jacquie Nicholls Endeavour Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor who enters the greatest number of exhibits in the Show. The winner will be decided on the number of exhibits and not the points scored by those exhibits.

ADULT CLASSES (also open to children, see Show Rule 11)

A Silver Trophy and £10 is awarded for the highest number of points gained at the Show in classes A1 - F55.

COOKERY - CLASS B

The Fincham Cup will be awarded to the person who gains the highest number of points in classes B8 - B18. In the interests of hygiene, where appropriate, exhibits should be covered with plastic film.

B8. A savoury pasty (ready-made pastry can be used) – men and boys only.

- B18. A jar of citrus marmalade.

ART - CLASS C

The Roseland Bowl will be awarded for the most outstanding piece of artwork in categories C19 to C24.

Art exhibits for the following classes are not to exceed 70cm in either height or width. All hanging exhibits to be strung.

- C19. A water colour.
- C20. A painting in oils or acrylics.
- C21. A picture in pastels.
- C22. A drawing in pencil, pen and ink or charcoal.
- C23. 'Country Life', any medium.
- C24. Young persons' class, aged 11-18: A picture in any medium (not photographs). Please state age to assist judging.

PHOTOGRAPHY - CLASS D

A special award will be made for the most outstanding photograph in the Show - The Silver Halide Presentation Cup. Photographs preferably mounted but not framed. Size of print should not exceed 180mm (7") x 130mm (5"). Date indicators should not be visible. No HDR photos.

FLORAL ART - CLASS E

The classes below are open to everyone; novice entries are encouraged. Bought flowers are permitted. Entries will be displayed on white covered trestle tables.

- E32. An arrangement of flowers and foliage in a jug. 600mm (2ft) width and height allowed.
- E33. An arrangement using 5 blooms with foliage (buds count as blooms). 600mm (2 ft) width allowed.

PRODUCE AND FLOWERS - CLASS F

Please note rule 8: Entries in Class F, Produce and Flowers, must be home grown by the Exhibitor.

A prize will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the most points in classes F34 – F50 inclusive. The winner of class F47 will receive the Fred Howgill Trophy. Please refer to 'Tips for Showing Vegetables and Fruit' at the back of the final Show schedule.

- F34. 3 beetroot (trimmed).
- F35. 3 potatoes red or white.
- F36. 3 carrots (trimmed).
- F37. 6 runner beans (stalks on).
- F38. A cucumber.
- F39. 3 courgettes.
- F40. 5 tomatoes.

- F41. 7 cherry tomatoes up to 35mm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ ") diameter.
- F42. 3 sweet peppers (mixed or same colour).
- F43. 3 cooking apples.
- F44. 3 dessert apples, stalks left on.

- F46. Any other fruit (please name).
- F47. The runner bean race: 4 beans laid end to end; longest row wins.
- F48. The heaviest tomato.

- F50. A bunch of culinary herbs, in a container (please list names).

The Summer Garden Cup, presented by Mr. P G Whitting, will be awarded for the most outstanding exhibit in classes F51 – F55.

Cash Prizes: 1st - £1.50; 2nd - £1.00. 'Highly Commended' certificates will be awarded at the judge's discretion.

Exhibitors to be 11 years of age or under. PLEASE STATE AGE ON THE DATE OF THE SHOW ON EACH EXHIBIT. Exhibits must be the child's own, unaided work.
