- 4.1 Committee News
- 4.1.1 Activity Mornings
- activity mornings have been well attended during the last six months an average of twelve
- have been changes in leaders during that time and we now have Ian Wright on behalf of TLG
- activity schedule for three months is in place
- 4.1.2 Countryside Day
- raised £396.50 : about £115 from stall-holder donations, the adult raffle £100, plant sales £75, the tombola £65, cakes about £30, cards and pamphlets £10
- visit by the mayor
- noted that publicity is needed in Biggin Hill
- AF reported a successful event for Friends of Darrick Wood

4.1.3 Website/Facebook

- website visits were 21,496 in March, now 25,486; history page the most popular
- Facebook page had 67 likes in March, now 95

4.1.4 Questions

- AF asked about relations with TLG; LH reported that matters are going well at present; TLG is investigating suppliers to produce a bespoke FoKC sign to indicate work in progress and also looking at more durable discs for the nature reserve path wayfinders
- LH reported work has been done on the sleepers on the steps by Caesar's Well, and Highways now need to do something about the drainage from Westerham Road

4.2 TLG/Forum Update

- TLG has produced a volunteer health & safety handbook with a lot of useful information and guidelines; these have been given free of charge to all active members
- TLG has developed a new Bromley Parks website which has just gone live; its address is www.bromleyparks.co.uk and it contains details of all 156 parks in the borough; longer term it will be the means of booking an event and reporting issues

Action: any comments on the website to LH

- TLG is working on a volunteer development plan with a task force of 11 representatives from TLG, the Friends Forum, Friends Groups and Community Links Bromley; the topic will be presented at the next Forum meeting on 5 October with a formal launch expected in early November; aims are to look at volunteer opportunities and how succession planning can work; it may also consider how companies in Bromley can help
- Friends Forum had a successful conference in June; 30 participants from Friends groups and 20 from TLG; next year's conference will be in May
- questionnaire about training needs to be issued soon
- there will be the usual request for information about the work of Friends groups this year, but there is no money for this information now that TLG has taken over; Friends Forum may be able to offer some money as an incentive
- Friends Forum AGM is on 16 November (post meeting note this has now been moved to 23rd Nov)
- AF asked about new groups and LH confirmed that Norman Park will have a group soon; some other groups are in decline

5. Treasurer's Update (TD)

- current balance £1273
- expenditure in the last year has been about £180; includes tools, pop-up bins, ink, laminates and hire of the hall; contribution of £50 to the parish magazine; £345 spent on fleeces and sweaters but about £250 worth have been sold; £45 on drain rods, a good investment for work on the ponds
- almost £400 from Countryside Day very pleasing and useful in our reserves
- LH thanked TD for completing the Local Green Space designation form and explained that we have not been successful; it should be noted that this is for smaller spaces and we do have other designations
- TD said that the group remains vigilant with regard to developments at Ravensbourne and Forest Lodge
