Act Justly, Love Tenderly, Walk Humbly

In February 2010 Northampton South & West Pastoral Area issued a Newsletter outlining Bishop Peter's vision for our Diocese.

A Summary The eight Deaneries had been replaced with thirteen Pastoral Areas, each headed by a Dean assisted by a Pastoral Area Link. Within each Pastoral Area a Steering Group was appointed consisting of one representative from each of the parishes involved. Their task was to develop a groundplan by a process of meetings and consultations to which all parishioners were invited to take part. The aim was to produce an overview of each Pastoral Area and then develop an accurate picture of each parish and its provision of service to the community. In particular to identify each Parish's strengths and the areas that they would aspire to develop and share in the future, with a particular focus on how they would manage with fewer priests.

The Groundplan for The Northampton South & West Pastoral Area, covering The Cathedral, Duston, Hunsbury, Aston le Walls, Daventry and Towcester Parishes was duly accepted by Bishop Peter last October. By this time St Aidan's Parish in Northampton had also been included.

Outcomes Bishop Peter met our Steering Group in October, and encouraged us to develop a Pastoral Area Council under the patronage of St Thomas of Canterbury. Our aim should be to promote the Pastoral Area and to develop the life and mission of the Church in line with our Groundplan. He emphasised our need to begin preparing for fewer priests. Also, that we should identify potential candidates for training as lay chaplains, look at the need for volunteers and at sharing resources.

Fewer Priests In February Bishop Peter wrote to Canon John Udris and the other Deans in the Diocese specifying the number of priests who would be available to serve their Pastoral Areas in the near future. He asked that our Pastoral Area should focus on how best to plan for managing with **five** priests rather than the current **eight**.

Action With this in mind our first Pastoral Area Council Meeting was held in March, at which all members of the Steering Group elected to continue their previous involvement. For ease of management it had already been decided that the Cathedral would work in conjunction with Duston and St Aidan's; Daventry and Aston le Walls would be paired as Mgr Séan Healy now had responsibility for both parishes and Towcester and Hunsbury would continue to work together, as before, led by Fr Brendan Killeen.

Currently Fr Séan is supported by Fr Andy Ollard, but in the event of there being only one priest serving two churches and three Mass Centres there would have to be a reduction in the number of Masses. Also should an older priest be appointed to this area, the considerable amount of travelling involved, would be too physically demanding. With Fr Phillip's illness St Patrick's Duston have already adjusted their weekend Mass schedule. It was envisaged that there would always be three priests in this grouping; two at the Cathedral and one at St Aidan's. However, if the numbers and times of Masses between the three parishes could be adjusted for just two priests to be able to celebrate over a weekend, then this would give some allowance for managing sickness and clergy holidays. One possibility might be to drop the evening Mass at the Cathedral on Saturday and the evening Mass at St Aidan's on Sunday.

You are asked to give these your consideration and help to determine how best to manage the Pastoral Area with three fewer priests. The pressure on our Priests should not be underestimated. If we want our Parish communities to flourish everyone should be committed, take an active interest and participate.
