Welcome to our Parish Newsletter

<u>Hello again!</u> In spite of the challenges of the recent few weeks and months of lockdown, one of the aspects of my priesthood that I have been both determined, privileged and able to continue is the celebration of the Mass; in our small Church here in Aston le Walls, albeit sadly without a congregation. During this time, I have sat in a different place from the usual 'presider's chair'. Seated on one of the benches usually given for the altar servers I have regularly found myself gazing at the beautiful stained-glass window to the right of the Altar which depicts Jesus and the two disciples at Emmaus, at the 'breaking of bread' (see above). It often seems that Jesus is looking straight at me, whilst his two disciples are either side of him intently watching Our Lord. I have found these moments profoundly uplifting for me and as I celebrate the 'breaking of bread', the Eucharist, at Mass the experience has enabled me to focus on what I am doing, and on my priestly calling. In a new way I have been moved by the fact that in the Eucharist the Lord is gazing upon each of us, with the same love He has for the two disciples. It is Jesus who seeks to come into my life. He desires to do this for us all. How do I respond?

Every time we participate in what is both the 'source and summit' of our lives as Catholics, every time we gaze upon the Blessed Sacrament at times of Exposition, even if remotely through the wonder of live-streaming, we are all being looked upon, lovingly, by Jesus. He calls, He invites us to draw near Him, to be evermore greatly conformed to Him, not out of fear, but a command to mirror His love for us, "Do this in memory of me". Equally in giving Him thanks praise for what He has done for each one of us we have a reminder that even though we are many, and unable to gather together right now we are, as St Paul says in our Second Reading today, "we form a single body" and what Jesus unites we must take forward as we journey from lockdown to the new opportunities and calling to be 'church'.

Coming Home! From Monday, the government will permit churches in England to reopen for private prayer, with social distancing and other stringent guidelines in place. Scotland and Wales will hopefully follow suit in the not-too-distant future. Although we have become accustomed to praying in our homes since March, we now have the wonderful opportunity of coming to God's house and sitting in the company of Jesus Himself in the Blessed Sacrament while praying. I am delighted to advise that **from next weekend** our Church here in Aston le Walls will, initially, be open for times of prayer on Saturday mornings (10.30am to 12 noon) and Sunday afternoons (from 2.30pm to 4.30pm). There has been quite a bit of temporary reconfiguring of seating arrangements downstairs. This takes us from two rows of pews, with an unacceptable 80 cm aisle to one central row of pews with a wider aisle each side: thus allowing a safer environment for everyone. There will also be a one-way system in operation. Due to all this, we are understandably restricted in how many people we can accommodate in the church building at any one time, but as current guidelines adapt and relax Fr James will be regularly reviewing the situation, alongside a team of willing volunteers who will be stewards during these times of prayer. There will be a separate letter given in the next couple of days which will provide further details and updates do not be afraid! Rejoice and be happy! This is a first step of renewal and re-opening fully! **Alleluia**!


Spiritual Communion Prayer
