### Confirmation as a New Years Resolution?

I've just re-read my January 2016 musings and if it hadn't been dated I might have thought that I wrote my comments for this January. Looking back I was thinking that 2015 was an unsettling year! Not as unsettling as 2016?! The Brexit Vote, Presidential election in the USA, continuing conflict in Syria and many other parts of the world, the list could go on.

The New Year is historically a time for looking back and looking forward; taking stock of the past and planning for the future. But when we live in such 'interesting times'; when so many complex issues are on our minds with no apparent solutions (of course you could say with justification "twas ever thus") then perhaps it might be a time to look inwards as well as outwards.

The tradition of New Years resolutions is about looking at ourselves and thinking about what we might change, but so often we make our resolutions in haste and soon give up on them as the New Year begins. Perhaps the real New Years resolutions are the ones that we think about for a while and then start in the New Year. ## January 1917 Key Events:

- The final Ottoman Army on the Sinai Peninsula are captured at the Battle of Rafa by the British 'Egyptian Expeditionary Force, Desert Column'.
- Danish West Indies is sold to the USA for US\$25M. The islands are now known as the US Virgin Isles.
- Austria-Hungarian troops capture Forlani, Province of Treviso in Italy.
- The most powerful explosion ever to occur in London takes place when the munitions factory in Silvertown, West Ham is flattened by a blast from over 50 tons of TNT. 900 homes are destroyed, 73 people die and more than 400 are injured. Red hot debris is scattered across London causing many fires and fragments hit the gas holder at Greenwich causing it to explode. The explosion was heard as far away as Southampton and Norwich.
