



# DACT DAYS OUT Sept – Dec 2015



## Here are some great trips to brighten your Autumn/Winter days

### Notes:

- 1) Cancellations:** We seem to have increasing problems with late cancellations and people actually not turning up on the day because they have forgotten, so again we would request that in fairness to us and the other passengers you only book trips you are fully committed to going on. Late cancellations meant that those that went to Chatsworth had to pay full price to get in as we ended up under the minimum number to get the group rate, plus the trip was run at a loss to DACT. This is a problem that must improve if we are to continue to provide this service.
- 2) Accessibility:** Our buses are all fully accessible. This means we have passenger lifts for those who cannot manage the steps; we can store mobility equipment on the buses including travel scooters and we can also take passengers that need to remain in their wheelchairs, but the space is limited. We do need to know your needs at the time of booking. Please contact the DACT Office if you require further information.
- 3) Feedback:** For all our trips we do welcome any feedback, good or bad – it helps us in deciding what trips to offer in the future. The most feedback we tend to get is on the length of time at a venue, for some too long and for others not long enough! When setting up trips we look at travel time, potential travel issues, how long to be at a venue (based on experience, previous feedback, travel guides etc.). We have also to be aware of the range of mobilities passengers may have and how long we are asking our volunteer drivers to be out, bearing in mind they have to pick up the bus, drop people off and then return the bus at the end of the day. We cannot please everybody but we will review any aspect of a trip based on your feedback. Without your feedback we can do nothing!

Tues 1 <sup>st</sup>	Cambridge	Historic City	9.30 am	3.15 pm	£14	A famous city steeped in history & tradition with some amazing architecture. There are the famous colleges, the River Cam with its punts etc, botanical gardens, museums and shopping centres. A lot to see and do.
Wed 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Springfield Centre, Spalding	Shopping	9.30 am	3.00 pm	£13	Springfield is an out of town centre in Spalding. It has a Garden Centre plus a number of shops (approx 55 in total) that include an M&S Outlet, Hotters, Designer Warehouse Outlet, Klass etc. In addition it has its 25 acre Festival Gardens that are free to explore.
Thurs 3 <sup>rd</sup>	Cotswold Wildlife Park, Burford	Zoo	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£12	160 acres of parkland and gardens that are home to a varied collection of mammals, birds, reptiles and invertebrates from around the world –including Penguins, Rhinos, Wolves, Wallabies, Lemurs, Flamingos, Monkeys, Crocodiles & Lions. A lovely and open place to visit for both the gardens and the animals. Entry: Group Rate – Adult £11.50, Seniors and Children £8.00.
Mon 6 <sup>th</sup>	Cirencester	Cotswold Town	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£12	Cirencester is a real market town, described as the 'Capital of the Cotswolds', full of Roman and medieval history and an excellent selection of independent shops and restaurants. . There are many places to visit, including the Abbey Grounds, parks, museums and Roman Amphitheatre, Monday is market day in the town centre.
Tues 8 <sup>th</sup>	The Quays / Billing Garden Village	Pub Lunch / Garden Village	11.30 pm	Approx. 3.15 pm	£8	The Quays pub is at the entrance to Billing Aquadrome, overlooking the Marina. After a meal there is a short stop at Billing Garden Village, a compact but interesting place to wander around, with a small garden centre, a Ponden Mill, clothes shop and some other smaller outlets including a Smiths Farm Shop. The Quays has various meal offers including 2 meals for £10.
Wed 9 <sup>th</sup>	Mystery Tour 3	Mystery Tour	10.15 am	5.00pm – at Dav	£13	Mystery tour with approx 3 stops for refreshments and browsing. At least one stop will be long enough for lunch and a look round – different route to previous mystery tours.
Thurs 10 <sup>th</sup>	Ely Cathedral	Historic Cathedral	9.45 am	3.30 pm	£14	A visit to the impressive and historically famous cathedral at Ely. You can also explore Ely itself, with it's lovely river walks. Cost of entry is £8.00 Adults and £6.50 for over 60s, and includes a very good guided tour (12.00 noon and 2.00 pm). Additional costs apply if you want to go up the Towers.
Sun 13 <sup>th</sup>	Wisley Flower Show	Gardens	9.30 am	4.00 pm	£18	This is the weekend of the Wisley Flower Show. Wisley is the flagship garden of the RHS with a rose garden with over 400 roses and 500 herbaceous plants, rock garden, alpine display house and state-of-the-art greenhouse with 3 climatic zones. A lot to see. If we have a minimum of 10 people Group rate of £10.80 per person will apply. RHS members free entry + 1 guest.
Mon 14 <sup>th</sup>	St. Ives, Cambridgeshire	Historic Town / Shopping	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£12	On a Monday Market Hill in St Ives is described as being full of market stalls. St Ives is a riverside market town and a tourist destination. A focal point is it's 15th Century Bridge with chapel spanning the Great Ouse River, one of only three such surviving bridges in England.
Wed 16 <sup>th</sup>	Gloucester Warwickshire Railway	Steam Railway	9.30 am	3.00 pm	£12	Take a ride on a steam or diesel train through the Cotswolds. The GWR runs between Toddington (Near Tewksbury) and Cheltenham Race Course, with stops at Laverton (via the 15 arch Stanway viaduct), Winchcombe and Gotherington. Various stations have tea rooms. Toddington has a small museum, a viewing area behind the loco sheds and a small display of classic vehicles. Various ticket options are available. Full return ticket is £14.40 adult, £13.50 over 60s and £6 children (5 to 15yrs) based on a minimum of 10 people travelling.
Thurs 17 <sup>th</sup>	Calke Abbey	House & Gardens	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£13	Historic great house in Derbyshire (National Trust) which has remained largely unchanged for most of the 20th century and contains some unique collections. There is also a landscaped park and walled gardens. Described as the 'unstately home' to let you see the decline of a country house estate. A fascinating and different place to visit. Restaurant on-site. <b>Our National Trust special rate applies - £4.45 per person.</b> For NT members entry is free.
Mon 21 <sup>st</sup>	Stratford-on-Avon	Historic Town	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£10	A very popular tourist attraction on the banks of the River Avon. Visitors can enjoy the park area either side of the river, take a river cruise, wander around the shops or visit one or more of the historic attractions such as Shakespeare's
Tues 22 <sup>nd</sup>	Market Harborough	Shopping	11.15 am	3.00 pm	£9	A popular market town with a good mix of shopping ranging from small independant shops to larger branded shops and an indoor market. The shopping area is partly pedestrianised. Architecture of interest includes the small timber framed Old Grammar School and the steeple of St. Dionysis Church.
Wed 23 <sup>rd</sup>	Milton Keynes Museum	Museum	12.30 pm	4.00 pm	£9	House Opened in 1973 the museum reflects the history of the area with exhibits ranging from agricultural, transport, horses, farming, gardens etc. There is a street of shops with a butcher's, Post Office, chemists etc, a cinema, and a glass hearse! There is also an old schoolroom, parlour and kitchen, a pianola, stocks, Anderson shelter and more. There is a large gallery telling the story of transport - from a sedan chair to Clive Sinclair's C5, a Penny Farthing, canal boat and more - the centrepiece is an enormous tram which was used to carry 100 workers from Stony Stratford each day to Wolverton. Cost: Group rate - Adults £6.50, Seniors £5.50.
Thurs 24 <sup>th</sup>	Henley-on-Thames	Historic Town / Shopping	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	On the banks of the River Thames Henley is world famous for its rowing events. It is a 12 <sup>th</sup> century market town with over 300 buildings designated as being of special architectural or historic interest, including St Marys Church, the Town Hall, Market Place and Henley Bridge. Thursday is market day and also on this Thursday there should also be a farmers market.
Sat 26 <sup>th</sup>	Malvern Autumn Flower Show	Flower Show	9.15 am	3.15 pm	£13	RHS annual flower show held at the Three Counties Showground, at the foot of the Malvern Hills. Show includes a Cider Garden, Harvest Pavilion, UK National Giant Vegetable Competition, Orchard Pavilion & Hop Yard, Vintage Village, World of Animals, a host of retail outlets and talks and demonstrations from TV gardeners and cooks – incl. Valentine Warner and Joe Swift. We have tickets that we will hand out on the day - Cost £14.50 ( <b>so there is no need for you to book online</b> ).
Mon 28 <sup>th</sup>	Boundary Mills, Walsall	Shopping	10.30 am	3.00 pm	£12	Shopping under one roof. Boundary Mills offers huge choice and discounted prices against leading names in ladies and men's leisure, outdoor and occasion wear, footwear and lingerie; luggage, bags and accessories; home furnishings, cookware, china and glassware; art, crafts and gifts There is also a large restaurant.
Tues 29 <sup>th</sup>	Moreton-in-Marsh / Bourton-on-the-Water	Cotswold Towns / Shopping	10.30 am	3.45 pm	£12	Visit to 2 very popular Cotswold towns. Market day in Moreton-on-Marsh attracts visitors from far & wide. Have lunch & browse the stalls before moving on to Bourton-on-the-Water.

Wed 30 <sup>th</sup>	Gloucester	Historic City / Shopping	9.45 am	3.30 pm	£14	Gloucester lies on the River Severn and has a rich historic past stretching back to Roman times. At its heart stands the Norman cathedral with its fan-vaulted cloisters and great east window. A walk down narrow cobbled streets and past ancient buildings leads into the main pedestrianised shopping area. It is then another short walk to the waterfront of the Victorian Docks with its converted warehouses, including a Waterways Museum. Pleasure boat trips are also available. Lots to do and see.

Thurs 1 <sup>st</sup>	Lincoln	Historic City	10.00 am	4.00 pm	£15	Historic city world famous for its impressive Cathedral and Castle, surrounded by cobbled streets with traditional teashops & craft shops. In addition there are museums, high street shopping and the Brayfield waterfront which has bars & restaurants overlooking the marina.
Mon 5 <sup>th</sup>	Worcester	Historic City	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	An ancient city with much to offer. There are 2 main shopping centres plus High Street specialist shops. There is the river where you can walk or take a cruise. There is the Royal Worcester porcelain factory to look round, and finally the famous Cathedral. All are relatively close together.
Tues 6 <sup>th</sup>	Toby Carvery, Hunsbury	Pub Lunch	11.30 am	2.30 pm	£8	A visit to the Toby Carvery in Hunsbury. They offer a 4 roast carvery (Gammon, Beef, Turkey & Pork) for approx £6. Other menu items are available.
Wed 7 <sup>th</sup>	Crich Tram Museum	Museum	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£14	Crich Tramway Museum is an authentic village with cobbled streets, overhead wires and trams. Ride on a tram through the village and get off at one or more of the stops to look round (there is a wheelchair accessible tram). There is an exhibition hall, a tram depot with a collection of restored trams, workshop viewing gallery, woodland walk, tea rooms and restaurant. Entry: Adult £9 adults, Seniors £8, Child £5 (Assuming we have a minimum of 10 people).
Thurs 8 <sup>th</sup>	Nottingham	Historic City / Shopping	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	Nottingham is described as one of the top retail centres in England. The centre has extensive shopping including the Victoria Centre (with over 120 shops), The Exchange, Cobden Chambers and Broadmarsh Shopping Centre. In addition there are museums, a city centre tram system and extensive pedestrianised streets.
Mon 12 <sup>th</sup>	National Memorial Arboreteum	Gardens	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£12	Autumn at the Arboretum - 150 acres of trees & memorial gardens, to both military and civilian services. Ever evolving this is a beautiful and interesting place to walk round with a wide range of memorials and many varieties of trees. One side of the arboretum is bordered by the River Tame, a lovely place to walk and view the wildlife. There is a road train (with commentary) that circuits the Arboretum (small cost). Mobility scooters are available (book in advance). Entry is free.
Tues 13 <sup>th</sup>	Melton Mowbray	Shopping	10.00 am	2.45 pm	£12	A popular destination - visit the home of the Pork Pie on Market day. Look round the, the extensive street market and the large indoor market where there is an antiques market and the auctioning of a range of livestock.
Wed 14 <sup>th</sup>	Imperial War Museum, Duxford	Museum	9.30 am	3.15 pm	£15	Duxford has a large range of civil and military aircraft through the ages. This includes Concord, Spitfires & Hurricanes, Flying Fortress, Lancaster, Vulcan. They are spread across a number of hangars, including a Battle of Britain hangar and a Land Warfare hangar that houses one of the finest exhibitions of tanks, military vehicles and artillery in the country. For those that need it a mobility vehicle should be operating to move people around the site. Cost : £13.20 adult, £11.55 senior, if we have a minimum of 10 people..
Thurs 15 <sup>th</sup>	Oxford	Historic City	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£12	A famous city that has a number of historic buildings, colleges and museums, such as the Ashmolean and the Pitt Rivers Museums. There are a large number of shops both indoor and outdoor plus an indoor market.
Mon 19 <sup>th</sup>	Kew Gardens	Gardens	9.00 am	3.00 pm	£18	Autumn at Kew. The world famous Kew covers 325 acres and includes lakes, extensive walkways, themed areas and a number of greenhouses housing a wide array of temperate plants and trees, including alpines and orchids. Mobility scooters available (book in advance). There is a land train (approx £4 for the day) that stops at various points around Kew. <b>With our excellent agreement with Kew we are able to offer this trip at a total cost of £18 (Bus and entry combined).</b>
Tues 20 <sup>th</sup>	Peterborough	Historic City / Shopping	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	A vibrant East of England city with a range of shopping options including its Queensgate Centre, extensive street shopping and a market. Close to the shops is Peterborough Cathedral, described as one of the finest Norman cathedrals in England, the burial place of two queens and the scene of Civil War upheavals. Lots to explore.
Thurs 22 <sup>nd</sup>	Batsford Arboretum, Near Moreton-in-Marsh	Arboretum	10.30 am	3.00 pm	£11	Autumn at Batsford Arboretum, covering 56 acres. Autumn brings with it a riot of leaf colour ranging from deep butter yellow through to orange reds and crimsons as well as an abundance of berries. There is a new wooden visitor centre with Garden Terrace Café, a gift shop and a plant centre within the walls of a Victorian kitchen garden. Cost: Adults £7.20, Over 65's £6.30.
Sat 24 <sup>th</sup>	Wellesbourne Market	Shopping	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£11	Reputed to be one of the UKs largest outdoor markets, with around 500 stalls and 15,000 visitors each Saturday. There is a vast variety of goods on sale for everyone, from clothes, gardening, toys, books, mobiles and food.
Mon 26 <sup>th</sup>	Leicester	Shopping	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£9	Leicester has its large modern Highcross Shopping Centre which includes major brands such as John Lewis, Debenhams and House of Fraser etc. Next to Highcross are the outdoor and indoor markets offering a wide range of foods and goods.
Wed 28 <sup>th</sup>	Bicester Avenue	Shopping	11.15 am	3.00 pm	£10	Bicester Avenue is a small avenue of shops (including Lakeland, Hobbycraft, Cotton Traders) and a large Wyevale garden centre that includes a restaurant and food hall.
Sat 31 <sup>st</sup>	Natural History, Science and V&A Museums, London	Museums	9.30 am	4.00 pm	£17	The Natural History Museum is a series of zones – the age of dinosaurs, ecology, the ever changing world, wildlife garden and the state of the art Darwin Centre & Cocoon. Next door is the Science Museum covering a wide range of topics such as space exploration, medicine & health, energy & flight. Across the road is the V&A Museum, claimed to be the worlds greatest museum of art & design. All museums FREE to enter – special exhibitions, simulators etc may be chargeable. Passengers could alternatively explore other parts of London from this base.

There is a main menu, a set menu offering for example 2 courses for £7.99, and a Golden Years menu offering 2 courses for £5.99 or 3 for £7.49.
Tues 10 <sup>th</sup>	Woodlands Garden Centre, Nr Hinckley	Garden Centre	11.15 am	3.15 pm	£9	Large Garden Centre, part of Gardening Club Group, in Stapleton (near Hinckley). Woodlands hosts a number of retail outlets including Cotton Trader, Lakeland, Edinburgh Woollen Mill and The Works. There is also a large restaurant.
Wed 11 <sup>th</sup>	Coventry	Shopping	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£8	Coventry has a number of attractions close together, within easy walking distance. There is an extensive shopping area with most major retailers present. There is also Coventry Cathedral and the Coventry Transport Museum (currently having a major transformation). Entry is free to the Transport Museum but there is an entry fee for the Cathedral .
Tues 17 <sup>th</sup>	Milton Keynes	Shopping	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£9	Milton Keynes is a very large indoor shopping centre with major brands such as John Lewis, Debenhams, House of Fraser, Next, M&S etc. This is the time that Middleton Hall, - in front of John Lewis - has it's popular Christmas themed display.
Thurs 19 <sup>th</sup>	Swindon Designer Outlet	Shopping	9.30 am	3.00 pm	£13	McArthur Glen's Swindon Designer Outlet is housed in the beautifully renovated Grade II listed buildings of the Great Western Railway Works and is one of the largest covered designer outlets in Europe. There are over 80 leading brands including outlets for M&S, Next, John Lewis along with a wide range of designer brands.
Mon 23 <sup>rd</sup>	Birmingham (Christmas German Market)	Shopping	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£11	Christmas in Birmingham. A popular shopping destination with it's modern shopping centre and large indoor and outdoor markets. Shop in the glamorous Bullring Centre, stroll up New Street & other shopping streets! Take a walk to the Ashmolean Museum and the stunning new Library with it's rooftop gardens and views over the City. At this time the popular German Market is spread along the length of New Street up to the Town Hall.
Thurs 26 <sup>th</sup>	Worcester (Christmas market)	Historic City	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	An ancient city with much to offer. There are 2 main shopping centres plus High Street specialist shops. Wed 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Boundary Mills, Grantham	Shopping	10.30 am	3.00 pm	£13	Boundary Mills ,Grantham, offers a large choice and discounted prices against leading names in ladies and men's leisure, outdoor and occasion wear, footwear, lingerie etc. In the same building there is a large Downtown Department Store selling a wide range of home, garden, electrical, fashions, toys and much more. Opposite there is also a Downtown Garden Centre. Boundary Mills and Downtown both have restaurants.

The Promenade is considered to be one of the most beautiful thoroughfares in the country, with its tree lined avenue flanked by smart shops and cafés. To register **FREE** for the DACT 'Days-Out' Scheme, simply telephone the number below stating you wish to register as a new member. You will be asked for your full name, address and date of birth. If you have any kind of mobility difficulties which you think we should be advised of, please notify us. (e.g. you perhaps need to bring a tri-walker on a trip)

#### Points to note:

- Booking will be on a first-come first served basis. For trips that are fully booked we will run a reserve list and contact people on that list if seats become available through cancellations.
- There are **NO** age restrictions applicable to DACT Days Out, but unfortunately all seats are charged at the same rate. This also applies to carers of wheelchair passengers etc.
- Price quoted is for return travel only. Admission charges are not included, unless otherwise stated. Food, drink etc is excluded.
- Payment in cash should be made to the driver on the day of the trip unless stated otherwise.
- Pick-ups The bus will leave from Daventry Bus Station at the time stated in trip details. **We will wait a maximum of 5 minutes only, in fairness to other passengers.** If a number of passengers from the same area are travelling, it may be possible to arrange another pick-up point en-route.
- **Drop offs - We will return to the Bus Station first and then any LOCAL Daventry passengers will be dropped off near to their homes on request. We are not able to offer a return home service to villages outside the Town.**
- DACT will do their best to make sure every trip operates as advertised. However in circumstances beyond our control or minimum numbers not being met, we may have to change or cancel – we cannot run these trips at a loss to DACT.
- Trip Information is obtained from a variety of sources. We try to give a fair summary of a destination but we cannot guarantee that all the content we may use is totally accurate.
- **Trolleys.** We can carry shopping trolleys but they must be booked in advance as there is only limited storage space on our buses.
- ***CANCELLATIONS. Please be aware that if you cancel your booking late, you prevent others from travelling on the trip who would otherwise have been able to go, and also if buses then get insufficient numbers, they run the risk of being cancelled. Please only book if you definitely intend to travel. All bookings are taken on trust without a deposit and we do not want to change this procedure to avoid heavy administration. Any trip cancelled at less than 3 full working-days notice prior to the trip date (or a no-show on the trip day) will incur the full trip cost. Please pay to the DACT Office as soon as possible.***
