Well here we are approaching the end to another year. After a disappointing start in early May we have had great support for the remainder of the 4 month period. We hope you have enjoyed the trips you have been on – despite all the rain we had in June! As always we welcome any feedback, good or bad. We also welcome suggestions for new venues. We do review them all.

Note:

- Some trips get booked up very quickly. If you cannot get on a trip it is always worthwhile to go on the 'waiting' list. If demand is sufficient we will always put on extra buses. Also it is always a possibility that cancellations will make spaces available.
- Accessibility varies across the venues that we visit – some have full access for wheelchairs etc and some partial access. If you have any concerns regarding accessibility we would request that you contact the venue and talk to them directly, or access their website. We can assist in providing contact numbers if necessary.
- If you want a travel scooter for a trip you can always hire one from DACT Mobility. We do ask you to talk to the office first, to make sure we have the right type of bus available. (N.B. Some venues do provide Scooters making it unnecessary to take your own. Ask the DACT Office if you need more details)
- **As a courtesy to other members and DACT, we once again ask you to only book trips you are committed to go on. Cancellations can affect a lot of people. They may result in trips being cancelled due to insufficient numbers or members losing the opportunity to get group rate entry. To mitigate any losses we may suffer on a trip because of cancellations we have amended our cancellation policy – some members appear to be slightly confused when we ask them to pay when cancelling late, so to be absolutely clear, full payment is required if cancelling trips with less than 5 full working days notice - full details, please see the conditions at the end of this leaflet. We have to do this to keep the whole DACT Days Out Scheme viable.**

Thurs 1 st	Anglesey Abbey, Nr. Cambridge	House & Gardens	9.30 am	3.00 pm	£14	A Jacobean style house with fine furnishings, books, paintings, silverware and a collection of rare English & French clocks. Outside there are 114 acres of woodland paths, herbaceous gardens, Rose gardens, Dahlia gardens. Formal gardens, wildflower meadows and more. There is also a working Mill and Water Wheel. Our National Trust special rate applies - £6.25 per person
Fri 2 nd	Lichfield	Historic Town / Shopping	10.30 am	2.45 pm	£12	Visit the small but popular Cathedral city of Lichfield. Visit the impressive cathedral and then wander through the city streets. On Friday there is a small market day in the Market Square.
Tues 6 th	Cotswold Wildlife Park	Parkland Zoo	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£12	160 acres of parkland and beautiful gardens that are home to a varied collection of mammals, birds, reptiles and invertebrates from around the world –including Penguins, Rhinos, Wolves, Wallabies, Lemurs, Flamingos, Monkeys, Crocodiles & Lions. A lovely and open place to visit. Entry: Group Rate – £8.00
Wed 7 th	Reg Taylors Garden Centre, Newark	Garden Centre	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£13	A garden centre with a difference Reg Taylors is set out over a 25 acre site. The garden centre itself sells a range of products from plants to giftware. The tea rooms offer a range of food and inside and outside seating. There is also a 9 acre Swan Sanctuary, an area of parkland and lakes that also is home to some rare and endangered species.
Thurs 8 th	Huntingdon	Historic Town	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£13	Huntingdon is the county town of Huntingdonshire and birthplace of Oliver Cromwell. It has a good sized pedestrianised shopping area that also has the Cromwell Museum. A short walk away is the River Ouse with it's riverside park and walks.
Sun 11 th	Wisley Flower Show	Gardens	9.00 am	3.15 pm	£18	This is the weekend of the Wisley Flower Show. Wisley is the flagship garden of the RHS with a rose garden with over 400 roses and 500 herbaceous plants, rock garden, alpine display house and state-of-the-art greenhouse with 3 climatic zones. A lot to see. If we have a minimum of 10 people Group rate of £11.70 per person will apply. RHS members free entry + 1 guest.
Mon 12 th	Peak District Mini Tour (likely to be sameTour as Aug 2016)	Peak District	9.15 am	At Dav approx 5.00 pm.	£16	Due to demand this is an additional mini-tour of the Peak District with it's beautiful scenery and picturesque small towns. This trip is likely to be a repeat of the one in August.
Tues 13 th	Toby Carvery, Hunsbury	Pub Lunch	11.30 am	2.30 pm approx	£8	A visit to the Toby Carvery in Hunsbury. They offer a carvery selection of 4 roasts meats for approx £6. Other menu items are available
Weds 14 th	Lincoln	Historic City	10.00 am	3.45 pm	£15	Historic city world famous for it's impressive Cathedral and Castle, surrounded by cobbled streets with traditional teashops & craft shops. In addition there are museums, high street shopping and the Brayfield waterfront which has bars & restaurants overlooking the marina.
Thur 15 th	Bletchley Park	Museum / Tourist Attraction	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£10	World famous for it's code breaking activities. Significant development work in 2014 means there is now more to see. This is where the code breakers worked and it shows how they operated. There are a number of huts to explore, war memorabilia on display, the Victorian Mansion and much more. Free guided tours take place throughout the day. Entry Cost: Adults £16.95 Adults, Seniors £14.75. (this gives you an annual pass) Entry is free if you already have a valid annual pass. Group rate applies if we have 12 or more people, £13.50.
Mon 19 th	Sudeley Castle	House & Gardens	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£13	In the heart of the Cotswolds Sudeley Castle is the only private castle in England to have a queen buried within its grounds – Katherine Parr, the last of Henry VIII's six wives. Visitors can walk round a number of the Castle rooms and learn the fascinating history of the Castle and it's royal connections. You can also look round the 15th Century church where Katherine Parr lies entombed, explore the themed garden areas, visit the Terrace Café and browse round the Visitor Centre shop. Entry: Adults £12.50, Seniors £11.50 (Assuming we have a minimum of 10 people).
Tues 20 th	Springfield Centre, Spalding	Shopping	9.30 am	3.00 pm	£13	Springfield is an out of town centre in Spalding. It has a Garden Centre plus a number of shops (approx 55 in total) that include an M&S Outlet, Hotters, Designer Warehouse Outlet, Klass etc. In addition it has its 25 acre Festival Gardens that are free to explore.
Thurs 22 nd	Mystery Tour	Mystery Tour	10.15 am	At Dav approx 5.00 pm	£13	Mystery tour with approx 2 or 3 stops for refreshments and browsing. At least one stop will be long enough for lunch and a look round – different route to previous mystery tours.
Sat 24 th	Malvern Autumn Show	Autumn Show	9.15 am	3.15 pm	£13	The Autumn Show at the foot of the Malvern hills has a wide range of things to see and do. The show includes a RHS Flower Show, Cider Garden, Harvest Pavilion, UK National Giant Vegetable Competition, Orchard Pavilion & Hop Yard, Vintage Village, World of Animals, a host of retail outlets and talks and demonstrations from TV gardeners and cooks – incl. You can wander round the town to see the historic buildings, stroll along the river and browse the shops. Today is market day - Bakewell is described as having the only market in the Peak District National Park with around 160 stalls spread across 2 sites.
Tues 27 th	Stratford-on-Avon	Historic Town	10.30 am	3.15 pm	£10	A very popular tourist attraction on the banks of the River Avon. Visitors can enjoy the park areas either side of the river, take a river cruise, wander around the shops or visit one or more of the historic attractions such as Shakespeare's House
Wed 28 th	Cadbury World	Themed Attraction	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£13	A visit to Cadbury World is not a factory tour, it is a self guided exhibition tour. There are 14 zones including a 4D cinema, a Cadabra ride through a chocolate wonderland, Aztec Jungle, Advertising Avenue, Chocolate Making, Cadbury Story and more. There is also a large Cadbury shop and a Restaurant. Entry: Adult £16.75, Seniors £12.65 and Children £11.95. A discount may apply if we have a minimum of 15 people.

Thursday is market day and on this Thursday there should also be a farmers market.

Sun 2 nd	Imperial War Museum, London	Museum	9.30 am	3.30 pm	£14	IWM London has a number of diverse displays covering WW1 to more current conflicts. Displays include: Reel to Reel: A century of War Movies, A Womans War, WW1 Galleries, Afghanistan, The Holocaust Exhibition, Fighting Extremes: Ebola to ISIS, A Family In Wartime, Secret War, Witnesses To War and more. Objects on view include a Harrier Jump Jet, Spitfire, V-2 Rocket, a T-34 Tank and other vehicles. Entry is free.
Tues 4 th	Moreton-in-Marsh / Bourton-on-the-Water	Cotswold Towns / Shopping	10.30 am	3.45 pm	£12	Visit to 2 very popular Cotswold towns. Market day in Moreton-on-Marsh attracts visitors from far & wide. Have lunch & browse the stalls before moving on to Bourton-on-the-Water.
Wed 5 th	The White Horse, Broughton Astley	Pub Lunch	11.30 am	2.30 pm	£9	Pub lunch at the White Horse in the village of Broughton Astley (near Lutterworth). The menu includes 2 main meals for the price of one.
Thurs 6 th	Evesham Country Park	Shopping	10.15 am	2.30 pm	£11	Evesham Country Park is in a countryside setting with an extensive garden centre, farm shop, courtyard shops and restaurants. The number of shops has been extended and include Klass, Fat Face, Mountain Warehouse, Roman and Pavers.
Mon 10 th	Dobbies Garden Centre, Atherstone	Garden Centre	11.15 am	3.00 pm	£9	Popular garden centre just past Hinckley. A typical large garden centre that also Includes a clothing outlet and food hall. Also has a large restaurant.
Tues 11 th	Melton Mowbray	Shopping	10.00 am	2.45 pm	£11	A popular destination - visit the home of the Pork Pie on Market day. Look round the, the extensive street market and the large indoor market where there is an antiques market and the auctioning of a range of livestock.
Wed 12 th	Black Country Museum, Dudley	Themed Attraction	10.00 am	3.30 pm	£13	Described as a living open-air museum. The main area has 'streets' of factories and shops as they were in the early 1900s, with people in costume to tell you about what was sold and made in those days. There is much to do and see – take a tram ride, go down a coal mine, go to school!, take a canal trip into limestone caves, watch local craftsmen at work, view historic buildings & a vehicle collection.. Entry: Group rate: Adults £12, Seniors £10.

Tues 18 th	Peterborough	Historic City / Shopping	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£13	A vibrant East of England city with a range of shopping options including it's Queensgate Centre, extensive street shopping and a market. Close to the shops is Peterborough Cathedral, described as one of the finest Norman cathedrals in England, the burial place of two queens and the scene of Civil War upheavals. Lots to explore.
Wed 19 th	Batsford Arboretum / Cotswold Falconry Centre	Arboretum / Birds of Prey	10.30 am	3.00 pm	£11	Two attractions at the same location – you can choose one or both. 1) Autumn at Batsford. The Arboretum covers 56 acres, and has different things to see all year round. At this time we hope to see the Autumn colours. There is a visitor centre with it's Garden Terrace Café, a Gift and Garden Shop and a Plant Centre. Entry: Adults £7.00, Over 65s £6.00 2) Cotswold Falconry Centre houses around 150 birds of prey ranging from Vultures to Owls. You can walk through the Owl woods and see birds in natural settings. There are also flying displays at set times during the day that last about 1 hour, with the possibility of maybe holding a bird on a gloved hand. Entry: Adult £10, Concessions £7.50, Children £5.00.

Mon 24 th	Kew Gardens	Gardens	9.00 am	3.00 pm	£18	Autumn at the world famous Kew Gardens. Kew covers 325 acres and includes lakes, extensive walkways, themed areas and a number of greenhouses housing a wide array of temperate plants and trees, including alpiners and orchids. Mobility scooters available (book in advance). There is a land train (approx £4 for the day) that stops at various points around Kew. With our excellent agreement with Kew we are able to offer this trip at a total cost of £18 (Bus and entry combined).
Tues 25 th	Red Lion, Adderbury	Pub Lunch	11.15 am	2.30 pm	£9	Part of the Old English Inns group this is an old Coaching Inn that overlooks the village green in Adderbury (near to Banbury). There is an extensive menu plus meal deals such as 2 courses for £5.99 or 3 for £7.49.
Thurs 27 th	Severn Valley Railway	Steam Railway	9.30 am	3.45 pm	£13	Travel by steam train through some beautiful Worcestershire countryside, including a stretch alongside the River Severn. The train runs from Kidderminster to Brignorth, a journey of just over 1 hour. In between are a number of stations providing the opportunity to get off and explore. Stop off at Highley to look round the engine house with it's engines and exhibition. Fares vary up to a fully flexible 'freedom of the line' ticket price at £19.00 adults, £18.00 over 60s and £13 children.

Wed 9 th	Nottingham	Historic City / Shopping	10.15 am	3.30 pm	£12	Nottingham is described as one of the top retail centres in England. The centre has extensive shopping including the Victoria Centre (with over 120 shops), The Exchange, Cobden Chambers and Broadmarsh Shopping Centre. In addition there are museums, a city centre tram system and extensive pedestrianised streets.
Thurs 10 th	Boundary Mills, Grantham	Shopping	10.30 am	3.00 pm	£12	Boundary Mills ,Grantham, offers a a large choice and discounted prices against leading names in ladies and men’s leisure, outdoor and occasion wear, footwear, lingerie etc. In the same building there is a large Downtown Department Store selling a wide range of home, garden, electrical, fashions, toys and much more. Opposite there is also a Downtown Garden Centre. Boundary Mills and Downtown both have restaurants.
Sat 12 th	Natural History/Science/V&A Museums, London	Museums	9.30 am	4.00 pm	£17	The Natural History Museum is a series of zones – including the age of dinosaurs, ecology, the ever changing world, wildlife garden, the Darwin Centre & Cocoon and much more. Next door is the Science Museum covering a wide range of topics such as space exploration, medicine & health, energy & flight. Across the road is the V&A Museum, claimed to be the worlds greatest museum of art & design. All museums FREE to enter – special exhibitions, simulators etc may be chargeable.
Tues 15 th	Woodlands Garden Centre, Nr Hinckley	Garden Centre	11.15 am	3.00 pm	£9	Large Garden Centre, part of the Gardening Club Group, in Stapleton (near Hinckley). Woodlands hosts a number of retail outlets including Cotton Trader, Lakeland, Edinburgh Woollen Mill and The Works. There is also a large restaurant.
Wed 16 th	Coventry	Shopping / Attactions	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£8	Coventry has a number of attractions close together, all within easy walking distance. There is an extensive shopping area with most major retailers present. There is also Coventry Cathedral (donation requested) and the Coventry Transport Museum which has undergone an extensive £9 million makeover - it is a great place to visit, has a restaurant and entry is free .
Thurs 17 th	Brampton Halt, Lamport	Pub Lunch	11.30 am	2.30 pm	£7	Located in the Northampton countryside and right next to the Lamport & Northampton Steam Railway. There is an extensive menu. Meal prices vary but a number of menu items are included in a 2 main meals for £13.95 offer
Tues 22 nd	Milton Keynes	Shopping	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£9	Milton Keynes is a very large indoor shopping centre with major brands such as John Lewis, Debenhams, House of Fraser, Next, M&S etc. This is the time that Middleton Hall, - in front of John Lewis - has it’s popular Christmas themed display.
Wed 23 rd	Leicester	Shopping	10.15 am	3.00 pm	£9	Leicester has it’s large modern Highcross Shopping Centre which includes major brands such as John Lewis, Debenhams and House of Fraser. Just outside of Highcross are the outdoor and indoor markets offering a wide range of foods and goods.
Thurs 24 th	Worcester (Christmas market)	Historic City	10.15 am	4.00 pm	£17	Today is the start of the Worcester Victorian Christmas Fayre, a Victoria- themed street market with around 200 stalls. Worcester has 2 main shopping centres plus High Street specialist shops. There is the river where you can walk or take a cruise (depending on time of year). There is the Royal Worcester porcelain factory to look round, and finally the famous Cathedral. All are relatively close together.
Tues 29 th	Birmingham (Xmas German Market)	Shopping	10.15 am	3.15 pm	£11	Christmas in Birmingham. A popular shopping destination with it’s modern shopping centre and large indoor and outdoor markets. Take a walk to the Ashmolean Museum and the stunning new Library with it’s rooftop gardens and views over the City. At this time the popular German Market is spread along the length of New Street up to the Town Hall.

The lunch time menu offers main courses ranging from £5 to £7. A starter or dessert can be added for £3.00.
Thurs 8 th	Winchester (Christmas Market)	Historic Town	9.30 am	3.30 pm	£18	Winchester is a city world famous for it’s cathedral and other historic buildings, including The Great Hall & King Arthur’s Round Table. In addition there are a variety of museums, shops and parks all within a reasonably compact area. Today there is a Christmas Market with wooden chalets situated in the Cathedral’s historic Inner and Outer Close, surrounding an open-air ice rink.
Mon 12 th	Solihull	Shopping	11.15 am	3.45 pm	£10	Solihull has it’s modern Touchwood indoor shopping centre plus outside a very pleasant pedestrianised area. It has John Lewis, House of Fraser, Bhs and a host of other retail outlets. There may be a Christmas market in the square.
Wed 14 th	Blooms Garden Centre, Dunchurch	Garden Centre	11.30 am	3.00 pm	£7	Popular garden centre near to Dunchurch. Part of the Gardening Club chain, offering a wide range of goods and plants. Has a large restaurant. Outlets include Edinburgh Woollen Mill, Mountain Warehouse, Hotter Shoes & The Works
Thurs 15 th	Milton Keynes	Shopping	11.15 am	3.30 pm	£9	Milton Keynes is a very large indoor shopping centre with major brands such as John Lewis, Debenhams, House of Fraser, Next, M&S etc. This is the time that Middleton Hall, - in front of John Lewis - has it’s popular Christmas themed display.
Wed 21st	Wheatsheaf Pub, Crick	Xmas Meal	11.30 am	3.00 pm	£7	A popular traditional village pub set in a former Coaching Inn in the village of Crick . Today they are serving Christmas Lunch. Cost will be between £15 - £20 depending on 2 or 3 courses .Menu choices will be made available nearer to the date and must be pre-booked.

To register **FREE** for the DACT 'Days-Out' Scheme, simply telephone the number below stating you wish to register as a new member. You will be asked for your full name, address and date of birth. If you have any kind of mobility difficulties which you think we should be advised of, please notify us. (e.g. you perhaps need to bring a tri-walker on a trip)

Points to note:

- Booking will be on a first-come first served basis. For trips that are fully booked we will run a reserve list and contact people on that list if seats become available through cancellations.
- There are **NO** age restrictions applicable to DACT Days Out, but unfortunately all seats are charged at the same rate. This also applies to carers of wheelchair passengers etc.
- Price quoted is for return travel only. Admission charges are not included, unless otherwise stated. Food, drink etc is excluded.
- Payment in cash should be made to the driver on the day of the trip unless stated otherwise.
- Pick-ups The bus will leave from Daventry Bus Station at the time stated in trip details. **We will wait a maximum of 5 minutes only, in fairness to other passengers.** If a number of passengers from the same area are travelling, it may be possible to arrange another pick-up point en-route.
- **Drop offs - Passengers within Daventry Town may be dropped off close to home on the return trip where practicable. This is purely a courtesy by the driver and we would ask passengers not to abuse this courtesy.**
- DACT will do their best to make sure every trip operates as advertised. However in circumstances beyond our control or minimum numbers not being met, we may have to change or cancel – we cannot run these trips at a loss to DACT.
- Trip Information is obtained from a variety of sources. We try to give a fair summary of a destination but we cannot guarantee that all the content we may use is totally accurate.
- **Trolleys.** We can carry shopping trolleys but they must be booked in advance as there is only limited storage space on our buses.
- ***CANCELLATIONS. Please be aware that if you cancel your booking late, you prevent others from travelling on the trip who would otherwise have been able to go, and also if buses then get insufficient numbers, they run the risk of being cancelled. Please only book if you definitely intend to travel. All bookings are taken on trust without a deposit and we do not want to change this procedure to avoid heavy administration. Any trip cancelled at less than 5 full working-days notice prior to the trip date (or a no-show on the trip day) will incur the full trip cost as it is unfair to other passengers to have their trip cancelled at short notice. Please pay to the DACT Office as soon as possible.***
