We have been able to expand our support for computers with the aid of a grant from the Okehampton United Charities and have attracted over 25 people from Okehampton and the Hamlets who wanted to start with new computers, upgrade their existing one or simply learn about them. Complex Care Team. We have continued to work on this project with staff from the NHS, and Social Services linking clients at risk with support from the voluntary sector. The number of referrals is steadily rising and we are preparing to create a home visiting service for Okehampton district and south Torridge where there is an unmet need and their is no current support available. Foot Care. This service continues to grow and we have been able to operate two chairs a session at the Okehampton Hospital. Age Concerns in Devon.
