

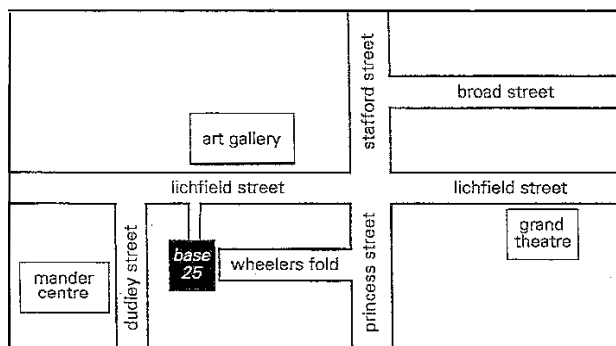
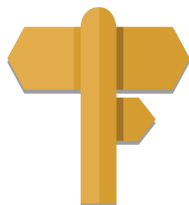

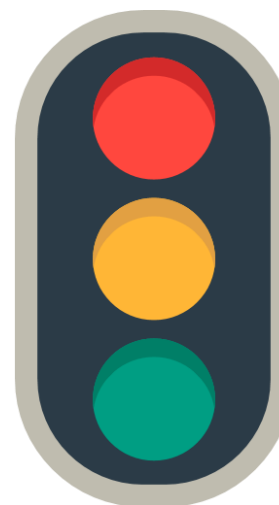

Reducing Harmful Sexual Behaviour



Red

Sexual behaviours that are problematic or harmful, forceful, secretive, compulsive, co-ercive or degrading signal the need to provide immediate protection and follow up support

Amber

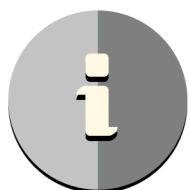
Sexual behaviours that are outside normal behaviour in terms of persistence, frequency or inequality in age, power or ability signal the need to monitor and provide extra support

Green

Sexual behaviours that are normal, age appropriate, spontaneous, curious, mutual, light hearted and easily diverted experimentation provide opportunities to talk, explain and support.

Harmful Sexual Behaviour can be defined as:

“Sexual behaviours expressed by children and young people under the age of 18 years old that are developmentally inappropriate, may be harmful towards self or others and/or be abusive towards another child, young person or adult.”

(Hackett, Holmes and Branigan, 2015)

Harmful Sexual Behaviour includes:

- **using sexually explicit words and phrases**
- **inappropriate touching**
- **using sexual violence or threats**
- **full penetrative sex with other children or adults**

Base 25's RHSB supports children & young people up to the age of 25 yrs

Our RHSB project is a holistic, child centred, solution focused intervention. We are AIM Project accredited to use the AIM3 and AIM Under 12's Assessment Tools. We also utilize the accredited PROFESOR assessment tool (Worling 2017).

These allow us to gather information from the child or young person & their support network to explore identified risks alongside positive protective factors, from which an individual plan of work is formulated.

The individual plan of work aims to:

- **examine underlying reasons or triggers for the behaviour**
- **understand the needs of the child/young person that are being met by the behaviour**
- **identify the protective factors and strengths that can be used to manage or reduce it**

The task of the RHSB project then, is to evaluate how the child and their family can best rebuild their lives and move on from the harm in safe ways.

Base 25 is a multi-disciplinary organisation. As such our approach to support is informed by an eclectic range of theory. The RHSB project draws from an Integrated Biopsychosocial (Rich 2010) model that incorporates Developmental, Psychodynamic and Behavioural theories.

The RHSB project operates in accordance with WSCB's Children & Young People Harmful Sexual Behaviour Multi-Agency Practice Guidance. It is endorsed by Steve Bore (HSB Specialist Consultant).
