Three hours of bright, jolly entertainment. Everyone worked very hard indeed to give the audience superb value for money and a genuine 'feel good factor' to take home with them. Congratulations, LIDOS!

This was a fun and colourful production, much improved on previous LIDOS pantos. My criticism would be that it was over long, especially the first half, and could so easily have fallen flat as audience got restless and fidgety. Players worked hard to keep it energised though and in the end it was a cheerful evening's entertainment.

The biggest complaint I have about the show was its length. The show was the best part of three hours, which is simply too long. It could have been have been tightened up, certain things dropped and saved a good half hour on the show. With a show that starts at 7pm, and finishes pretty close to 10pm and a lot of children in it and seeing it, it's a hard ask. That said, there was a fair bit of variety to keep the children occupied and I think that this was the strongest pantomime LIDOS have done in years, but I did feel they were losing the adults in the audience towards the end of the show, and it's something to bear in mind for the future.






