Urgent warning following internet blackmail scam

Detectives in York have issued an urgent warning after three men from the York area have been blackmailed by a woman claiming to be called Cathy Wong.

The woman has befriended them on Facebook and asked them to skype her. She has then enticed them into performing an indecent act

which she has recorded on

video.

She has then told the men, who are all students, that her grand-mother is ill and needs money and has asked them each to send £3,000 via money transfor.

When they refused to send the money, she has threatened them with uploading the video to Youtube.

It is believed that the scam is occurring world wide, however these are the first cases reported in the York area. The men are not known to each other and officers are concerned that there may be other victims. Officers are exploring the possibility that the scam is operated by an organised crime

group.

Police are urging internet users, particularly students, to be on their guard and to contact them if they believe they have been targeted.

Detective Sergeant Rebecca Dyer of York CID, said: "This scam is causing considerable distress to the victims and I urge anyone who uses any kind of social networking site to be very wary of what they are getting into.

"I am concerned that there are other victims of this scam who are too embarrassed to come forward about what has happened. I urge them to please get in touch with the police. Your information will be dealt with in the strictest confidence and with sensitivity. Please do not suffer in silence."

February

Spring is in sight!

This month there are signs of the approaching spring, with bulbs appearing and wildlife waking up as light levels and temperatures increase. There's plenty to do indoors this month to prepare for the season ahead. Outdoors, as the garden comes to life again, it's time to prune shrubs and climbers, such as Wisteria as well as evergreen hedges. Top 10 jobs this month

- 1. Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover
- 2. Chit potato tubers
- 3. Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines and peaches
- 4. Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off
- 5. Prune winter flowering shrubs that have finished flowering
- 6. Divide bulbs such as snow-

drops, and plant those that need planting 'in the green'

- 7. Prune Wisteria
- 8. Prune hardy evergreen hedges and renovate overgrown deciduous hedges
- 9. Prune conservatory climbers
- 10. Cut back deciduous grasses left uncut over the winter

Coneysthorpe Table Tennis Club

With nearly two thirds of the 2014/2015 York & District Table Tennis League season completed, the two Coneysthorpe teams, whose home venue is Swinton Reading Rooms, have so far experienced mixed fortunes in Division 1.

The A team, champions for the last five seasons, and with victories in 11 out of 13 matches played so far, are again favourites for the title.

However, despite the fact they currently lead the table by 16 points from their nearest challengers, York RI A, the latter have a match in hand, and with a maximum of 10 points available for a win nothing can be taken for granted.

Indeed, with Ashley Hodgson currently out injured, the pressure is really on the A team as York RI A are closing the gap.

Martin Lowe has won all his 35 sets, only missing one match which was lost 2-8 to York RI A. James Rule, fully justifying

his promotion from the B team, has won 31 out of 35 sets.

Hodgson has recorded 26 wins from 30 sets.

With Rule absent and Hodgson injured during the match with York RI B and being unable to continue, Coneysthorpe A also lost 4-6.

Hodgson's recovery is, therefore, crucial to the A team's hopes of the title.

It was always going to be something of a struggle for the B team this season without James Rule, and the retired Ian Stansfield, and that is reflected in the results - played 13, won 3, drawn 1, lost 9.

They are presently second from bottom, 16 points clear of Clarence B who have a match in hand.

University A are the closest to them, 5 points better off.

Joel Wright is the leading player with 20 victories from 39 sets. Fortunately for the B team automatic relegation applies only to the bottom team. If, as seems likely, the B team finish second from bottom they will be involved in an end of season play off with the second placed team in Division 2 which, on paper at least, the B team really should win.

In the Shepherd Trophy knockout competition, Coneysthorpe fielded three teams.

A and B were successful in the first round, whilst C lost and will now play in the Machell Trophy.

The next round of both competitions takes place in mid-February.
