Thank you to everyone who supported the project, to

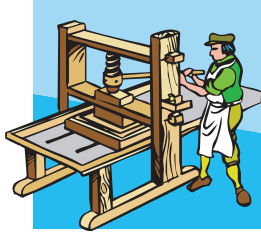
those who helped on the day and to the villagers who turned out in such numbers.

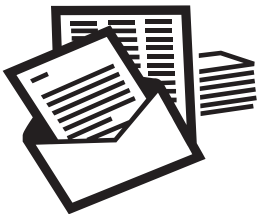

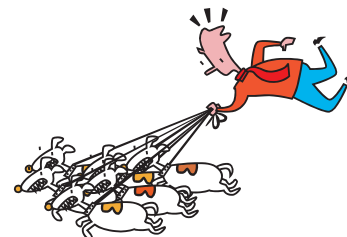


Dog Fouling

A holding reply has been received from Victoria Garside, Senior Officer, Chief Executive's Office regarding the lack of response to previously raised concerns regarding potholes and footpaths, NYCC, the complaint has been recorded as a stage 1 complaint and forwarded to the Business and Environmental Services department to be dealt with.

Another reply has been received from Richard Marr, who has asked his inspector Neil Jefferson to carry out an immediate inspection of the paths and potholes in Swinton. Pot holes outside Hornsey Meats have now been filled in; after a village inspection there appears to be 37 holes that need urgent repair on Low Lane, Swinton.
