In the evening there will be Karaoke at the Blacksmith Arms.

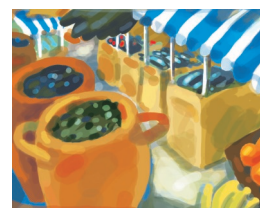

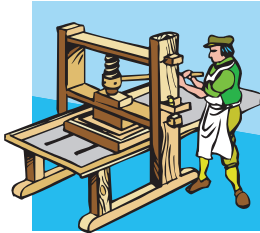

Planning is in full swing, Help is required to assist in manning Stalls, organising the events, and general duties.

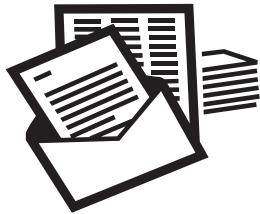
Remember it's a Village event and requires support from everyone. Every little bit of support will ensure everyone has a great day.

Howardian Hills Grant

As you may be aware the Parish Council applied for and were successful in obtaining a grant from The Howardian Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The three tubs on the triangle at the bottom of Swinton Grange Lane, the bench on the opposite side of the lane and the trees and shrubs on the north side of the B1257 just past Longacre have been purchased with this grant.

It was a long and frustrating

job as due to there being underground telephone cables in this area we had to obtain permission from BT which took eight months and then request a licence to plant from NYCC Highways Department.

Also included in the bid was a stone trough which will be placed to the side of Hornsey Meats. We thank Mr & Mrs Peter Bentley for allowing us to place it there.

The trough will be carved with the words "THE FORGE" and marks the site of the old black-

smith's shop.

We are expecting it to be delivered very soon and then it will be planted up.

We have had many positive comments from people passing through the village and we would like to take this opportunity to thank those of you who live in Swinton who have commented favourably on our efforts.

Swinton Through The Census 1911



Swinton

The 1911 census was taken on the night of Sunday 2 April and more information was sought, including the duration of current marriage, number of children born and still living and the number of children who had died. Also, the number of rooms of the property as follows; count kitchen as one room but do not count scullery, landing, lobby, closet, bathroom nor warehouse, office or shop.

When the 1911 census was released, it was the first time that the actual form filled in by householders was made public, so it is possible to see relative's handwriting. At least one householder in Swinton signed with a cross so someone must have helped to fill in the form.

The number of households had increased to 93 from 63, males to 186 from 161 and females to

210 from 163. The largest household was that of Clive Behrens of Swinton Grange with his wife, two sons, one daughter and seventeen servants. The oldest person was eighty-five year old Edith Wilson and the youngest was a three day old baby boy in the Wardell family.

More addresses appeared in 1911 so it may be possible to see who was living in your house at this time.

Frederic Tinsley in the pub, Jane Butterick at Low Lodge, Swinton Lodge, Whitehead at Home Farm, George Pettinger at Close Farm, Salton Parkinson at Tricker Castle, John Bowes at Rock Cottage, Henry Train at Manor Farm, John Bentley at Lavender Cottage, John Hickson at Butcher shop and house, James Milner at Rose Cottage, James Halliday

at Swinton Gatehouse and James Stubbs at the Post Office. Living at Wellgarth were the households of George Sellars, Herbert Snowdon, Eliza Woodall, William Boyes and Harry Cooper but no details are given about which cottage.

Residents were born in Glos, Herts, Nouthumberland, Bucks, Cheshire, Herefordshire, Manchester, London, Sligo, Oxford, Kent, Northants, Norfolk, Surrey, Birmingham and Secunderabad in India.

In responding to the Parish Plan questionnaire many of you suggested more village events and one idea put forward was a Safari Supper.

These can turn out to be enormous fun! There are different ways of doing it but a popular formula is as follows;-people gather at one house first for drinks and at the end receive an envelope containing their next host's name and address to go to for a starter course.

When that's consumed, the content of another envelope directs them to a further house and host for a main course. Everyone ends up at one house for a dessert course.

A note is kept by all hosts of the cost of the food provided. These are then added together and the total divided by however many diners participate, giving the amount of money to be contributed by each diner. The organiser requests that hosts live in Swinton, that vegetarians are catered for if necessary and suggests that food is sourced as locally as possible.

So what we are looking for in the first instance are people willing to provide a starter, main course or a pudding for 6 to 8 people.

We will need to know numbers in advance so if you're interested, whether in providing a course or just wandering from house to house eating.

Possible NHS Scam.

Please be aware of possible NHS scam. A North Yorkshire Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator received a telephone call from female with an Indian accent and number withheld claiming to be speaking on behalf of the NHS and requesting to clarify recipient's private details. The co-ordinator did not divulge any details and has since been in contact with the local surgery and the local PCT, neither of whom are aware of such an NHS request and are passing the report further up the chain. Please advise neighbours, particularly the elderly and vulnerable, not to pass personal details over the

phone. Thank you.

Bogus caller warning after 83-year-old woman targeted in Selby.

Police are warning people to be on their guard against cold callers after a man tricked his way into the home of an 83-year-old Selby woman.

Police were called just after 2pm today (Tuesday 1 May 2012) to reports that a man had called at the woman's home in Parkin Avenue, claiming to be from the 'water board' and wanted to check her water pressure.

He asked the woman to turn on the bathroom tap and stay there to check for vibrations.

A short time later, the woman went to find the man and discovered he had left the house

and taken an amount of cash from her purse.

Two other similar incidents were reported in the same road on the same afternoon, but thankfully the man was refused entry by the householders on both occasions.

The man is described as in his 20s, around 5ft 3in and was wearing a woolly hat.

Gardening Calendar May –June

Plants to Enjoy This Month



Wisteria Floribunda



Clematis 'Nelly Moser'

May sees the sun shining more and the days getting noticeably longer. As the weather warms up don't forget to keep an eye out for those weeds and unwelcome pests in the garden.

Regular hoeing will keep the weeds at bay. Keep checking plants for signs of pest attack. Don't allow aphids or slugs to get a hold but deal with them at the first sign of attack.

Fruit and Vegetables.

Don't forget to start feeding your beds, borders and vegetable patch for great results later in the season.

Continue sowing vegetables, particularly salad crops, little and often.

Protect young plants and veg

from slugs.

Trim back the side shoots of gooseberry plants.

Protect fruit bushes, especially currants and gooseberries from bird damage.

Feed fruit with Garden Fertiliser or Slow Release Plant Food.

Earth up potatoes.

Harvest overwintering onions, early varieties of beetroot and radishes.

Once your greenhouse tomatoes have flowers don't forget to tap them occasionally to help pollination

Jobs Around The Garden

Plant out sweet pea plants.

Trim and feed hedges.

Flowerbeds and borders can be fed using Slow Release Plant Food.

Feed acid-loving plants now

with Rhododendron, Azalea & Camellia Plant Food.

Top-dress around all acid loving plants such as Pieris, Heathers, Rhododendrons and Azaleas with Compost & 4 Month Feed.

Clear out and compost spring bedding.

Finish planting shrubs.

Mow lawns regularly and feed with Aftercut.

Spray susceptible roses and other plants with Plant Rescue Fungus Killer to prevent blackspot, mildew and rust from developing.

Support tall perennials to prevent damage.

Look out for the first greenfly on roses and whitefly in the greenhouse and treat with Bug Attack.

Protect young plants from

Swinton And District Horticultural Society (Continued)

slugs with Slug Attack.

Don't be tempted into putting out half-hardy bedding plants into the garden. A warm spell can be very encouraging; especially to beginner gardeners, but at this time of year a cold snap won't be far away. If your plants are shooting early they may need a little additional protection. Place a layer of horticultural fleece over any

plants that are unexpectedly beginning to develop strong spring growth, especially if a frost threatens.
